

AN OPEN RIVER.

An open Columbia river, from Kettle Falls to the sea, will not be realized for many years, and the removal of the obstructions to navigation between this city and Celilo will not be begun by the government for a long time.

It will make little difference to the people of The Dalles if the work above this point is indefinitely delayed, for in less than two years river craft will leave the wharves in this city and transport their loads, without breaking cargoes, to seaboard.

The most shameful act of any president since the war was that of President Cleveland appointing Judge A. W. Terrell, of Texas, to succeed Minister Thompson, of the city of Portland.

There is a possibility of this city becoming a rival to Portland in the eventful future, when, together with an open river to the sea, there are several railroad lines from this point, extending in every direction to the interior.

It does not seem necessary for a grievance to exist for a riot to take place in the streets of Paris, and the recent disturbance seemed to have had no adequate cause. But the mercenary disposition of the French people must be considered, and this may cause an ebullition at any time.
