PEACEFUL SETTLEMENT.

Balfour Makes a Statement Concerning the Venezuela Matter. LONDON, April 27.—First Lord of the Treasury A. J. Balfour, replying to Sir William Vernon Harcourt, the liberal leader, said in the house of commons today that the arrangements respecting Venezuela and other questions are the matters that Great Britain and the United States had in view during the recent negotiations.

Balfour said the government would deal with both the general question of arbitration and also with a special question connected with Venezuela, and it was confidently hoped that by patience and tact on both sides a peaceful and satisfactory solution of the matter will be attained.
