We have never heard the effects of a protective tariff so clearly shown as they were by him. That his remarks carried conviction to many there can be no doubt. He is in favor of the free and unlimited coinage of silver and certainly presented his side of this vexed question with force and logic. There is but very little doubt that the congressional fight really lays between Judge Northrup, the gold standard candidate, and Judge Bennett. If the populists become convinced of this fact the election will depend largely upon which of the above they would prefer to have their votes counted for.
