

overnor McCorkle advocates Its Con-WASHINGTON, May 8 .- Governo McCorkle, of West Virginia, appeared efore the house committee on com nerce today to advocate the construction of the Nicaragua canal.

He spoke in behalf of the coal interests in his own and adjacent states, declaring that that section would be able to control the coal markets of the Pacific coast, of North and South America, with the shipping facilities which would be afforded by the canal. At present all coal used on the Pacific coast, he stated, is mined in Australia. Japan and Vancouver.

He predicted that with the advancement of the Japanese they would monopolize the coal business of the coast unless the canal should be built, when the freight rates would enable West Virginia to undersell the Japanese.
