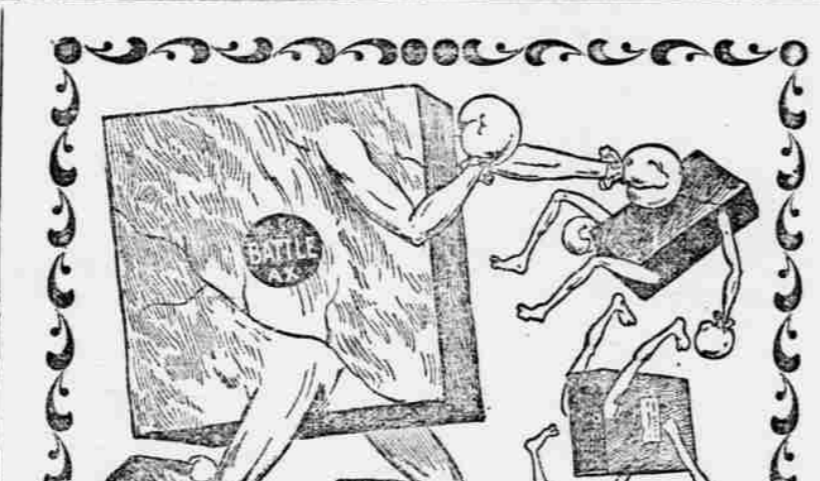

Meade and Winfield S. Hancock.
