ASTORIA'S GALA DAYS. Firemen Tournament Brings Out Close Contests.

ASTORIA, Or., Aug. 21.—The fourth annual tournament of the Oregon State Firemen's Association opened here this morning, and resulted in some of the closest contests ever witnessed between rival fire teams.

The day was very favorable for fast time, but past performances were not equaled in point of speed. None of the teams were as fast as those that competed in past years, but it is safe to say that never before was there a tournament so thoroughly enjoyed by all.

The best of the day was the 100 yard race, which was won by the team from Vancouver, who were also credited with 49 seconds. The Liberty hose team, of Portland, was next, and from their condition, looked like winners, but all three of the times were in the neighborhood of 50 seconds.

The excitement was intense and a proposal was made to divide the prize, but the members of each team insisted on running the race off later in the day. Oregon City was unable to do better than 52 seconds. In the hub-and-hub race, the first team to complete were The Dalles and Vancouver. The Dalles won easily in 31.35 seconds.
