ATHENS, May 11.—A collective note from the powers to the subject of mediation has been presented to the Greek minister of foreign affairs, M. Skoulodis, by the Russian minister, M. Onou. It is understood the Greek government has accepted the conditions proposed and conformed to the care of the powers. Attorneys, it is further stated, were taken at Constantinople today to stop the further advance of the Turkish troops.

Greece having accepted mediation, the ambassadors of the powers at Constantinople have been instructed to approach the Turkish government with a view to ascertaining upon what condition Turkey will agree to declare peace.

EFFORT TO SAVE DURRANT. Falling to Secure a Pardon the Courts Will Be Requested to Again.

SAN FRANCISCO, May 11.—The appeal of Theodore Durrant for mercy will be presented today to Governor Budd. Several petitions are in circulation in the city. While nothing will be done to change the laws on the subject of extradition, the provisions of the constitution are still being made for the contingency of failure.
