lution adopted is as follows : "Resolved, etc., That a condition of public war exists between the government of Spain and the government claimed and for some time main' ained by force of arms by the people of Cuba, and that the United States of America shall maintain a strict neutrality between the contending parties according to each and all the rights of belligerency in the ports and the terri-

The system of bounties is pernicious, but if we are to have a paternal form of government, it would be vastly better to extend beneficience to those on whom the wealth of the country depends-the farmers-than to foster the industries of those who are not real producers, but finishers of raw materials-the manufacturers.
