WASHINGTON, Feb. 23 -Otis has sabled the war departments as follows: Manila, Feb. 24.-Scandia arrived last night. On the nights of the 21st and 22d and yesterday the insurgent troops gained access to the outskirts 1000 entrenched themselves. They were completely routed yesterday with a loss in killed and wounded of about 500 and 200 prisoners. Our loss was very slight.


