THE TOWN OF PRINEVILLE HAS VOTED TO bond itself for \$10,000 for the purpose of inducing E. V. Gates, of Hillsboro, to erect a \$15,000 electric light plant and water system, and has, through its council, passed an ordinance granting the town of Prineville, for a term of years, the right to use the water system, the city agreeing to pay \$10,000 in advance for 20 fire plugs for 10 years, and reserving the right to condemn and purchase both plants at the expiration of ten years, the value to be determined by calculating the value of the water at 8 per cent, and the value of the electric light plant at the year previous to the condemnation, and the \$10,000 advanced as rent be a portion of the purchase payment.
