NEURO LYNECHES. They Punish One of Their Own Race for a Revolting Crime.

SARDIS, Miss., June 12.—Simon Brooks, (colored) has been lynched by a mob of negroes near here. The crime thus avenged was most atrocious. Saturday night a negro named Armstrong, while returning from a shopping tour to her home, was assaulted by Brooks and another negro.

The woman rallied sufficiently to give the alarm and the names of her assailants. Parts of the goods taken from the woman were later found in a trunk belonging to Brooks. The mob, which was composed entirely of negroes, did its work quickly. The white people knew nothing of the affair until hours after it occurred.

WICHITA, Kan., June 12.—While a party of young men were serenading Mr. and Mrs. Ray Higgins near Watson, Oklahoma, the bride and groom of two hours appeared on the front porch and ordered the serenaders to leave. The party, composed of about 20 friends of the young married pair refused to go. Instead they continued to make deafening noises by beating on pans and firing shotguns.

WASHINGTON, June 11.—The American advance from Manila south toward Paranaque confirms the recent reports that the war against the insurgents would be carried on despite the rains. General Otis recommended such a course some time ago, but the president was averse to subjecting the troops to any exposure which might bring a repetition of the terrible experience in the trenches around San Juan. The morning expedition against the advance on Paranaque, however, are considered sufficient proof that the rains will not necessitate inaction in the next two or three months, and that the advantage already gained will be followed up.
