

NEW YORK, July 24 .- A special to the Herald from Ottawa says Sir Wilfred Laurier's speech in the house of commons relative to the Alaska dispute with the United States has atracted great interest all over the Dominion and it is everywhere regarded as of high significance and

"My position in regard to this matter of the boundary dispute," said Sir Wilfred tonight, has not altered since I started it on May 30. We are willing to refer the question to any commission of arbitration that would be acceptable to any civilized nation or set of honor able men. As to the order of refer ence, we maintain that precedent set by the United States is one to which they should not in fairness object in this dispute, and that is the reference in the Venezuela boundary dispute. "My views upon the present unsatis-

factory statement of negotiations looking toward submission of the question of arbitration were fairly set forth in the remarks I made in the house of commons yesterday. I cannot add anything to them, nor do I wish to retract or quality one word which I uttered upon that occasion.




