THE MEXICAN TROUBLE.

From what we can learn from the latest dispatches, a collision between this country and Mexico, on account of the Cutting and Rasurez affairs, full and complete accounts of which are given elsewhere in this paper, can hardly be avoided, and indeed no effort should be made to avoid it.

Full protection should be given to our citizens along the border, at any cost. If it cannot be given them, the best thing they can do is to renounce their allegiance to the United States, and become citizens of Mexico, or some country that can protect them. It would be much pleasanter and safer. So far as Cutting is concerned there may be some just grounds for his arrest and imprisonment by the Mexican authorities, but in the case of Rasurez there can be none. He was a naturalized citizen of the United States, taken from American soil (if the telegrams report truly) under extradition papers, on a trumped up charge of theft. Once over the frontier he was brutally murdered. If the Mexican authorities use due diligence in the arrest and trial of his murderers, well and good. If not, they should be held to accountability. The trial of Cutting is concluded and he was sentenced to one year's imprisonment at Chihuahua, and a fine of \$600 imposed upon him.

No sooner was the fact of his sentence known than both towns, on the Mexican and American side, were wild with excitement over the matter. Secret meetings were held, and companies of minute men were organized. Merchants burn him if soldiers are not promptly on hand. They realize that congress only can declare war, but the superior number of Mexican soldiers in Paso del Norte would play havoc with the single company now at Fort Bliss, one mile from El Paso. Arms and ammunition are not scarce, however, and citizens are secretly organizing so as to act on the defensive. Their voice is unanimous for vindication of American honor and protection of our citizens. Mexicans, too, are angry at the tenor of our press, and the people are fearful of violence on account of numerous mass meetings that are being held. A dispatch from Rio Grande city, Texas, says a heavy force of Mexican revolutionists crossed the river into Texas on Thursday night. A troop of the Eighth United States cavalry was ordered, yesterday, from Ringgold barracks to pursue and disarm them. Altogether the situation of affairs is becoming rather serious and unless the matter is attended to promptly, and with no indecision by the government, doubtless Texas will take the matter in hand, herself, and we may look for razors in the air.

THE NEW BOARD.

As will be seen by reference to the county court proceedings published on our local page, the new board seems to be inclined to do things in a business like manner. The sheriff has been instructed to collect all delinquent taxes without delay. As delinquent taxes have been accumulating for many years past, it is high time they were settled up, or wiped out in some manner. The board does not hesitate to make liberal appropriations for roads and bridges when the same is deemed necessary, and this is right. There is always a lot of grumbling moss hicks who set up a howl every time an appropriation is made, and declare the county is going to the devil. If such people were regarded in the least, but very little progress would be made. The board also proposes to change the methods heretofore adopted in regard to taking care of the county poor and criminals confined in the county jail.

They will let a contract to some competent person to feed, clothe and care for the paupers at so much for each person per week. A separate contract will be given to some physician to furnish medicine and medical treatment to paupers and prisoners. No doubt this will be an improvement over the old methods.

IMMIGRATION FRAUD.

About the worst swindle that was ever perpetrated upon the people of Oregon was the appropriation of \$500,000 per year of their money to keep up a Board of Immigration for the benefit of Portland and different railway lines leading into the State. By the aid of highly colored pamphlets, and overwrought reports of the fertility resources and capabilities of the State, they have brought many people here, who after making the long journey and spending considerable of their worldly gear, find the falsity of their information, and in many cases are left stranded without means, and have to get along as best they may. To this cause may be attributed the low price of labor that is affecting our laboring classes. Willing hands are offered to perform work that does not exist. The stranded emigrant must live, and so works for whatever may be offered, thus ruining the interests of the laboring men. Unfortunately it is only the poor man that is caught by these seductive promises. The man with means can come and go as he pleases, so we are but little gainer from the wealthier class.

Just at the present time the Immigration Board and railroad agents are bending their energies towards fitting up an Exhibit car to show at fairs and exhibitions throughout the East, in the hope of attracting additional immigration to the State.
