## BREEDING OF ANGORA GOATS IN UNION COUNTY.

It was our good fortune, recently, to journey for a few days beneath the hospitable roof of Mr. Chas. McClure, of Ladd canyon, who is one of the most extensive stock raisers of Union county.

Mr. McClure, for the last year or two, has given his attention almost exclusively to raising Angora goats, and from him we gleaned much valuable information concerning these rare animals.

His band consists of about 1400 bucks and ewes. They were imported to this country by the late Jerry Dupont, of Ematilla county, and were purchased of him by the present owner. They are the only animals of the kind in Eastern Oregon, although in California the raising of Angora goats is becoming quite an important industry.

These animals are natives of Asia Minor, being found in the districts of Boyazar, Gerdele, and Castamboul. Although the goats of these districts are easily distinguished one from the other, yet for all practical purposes the value of the fibre produced does not differ.

The white Angora, the only one which has, to any extent, been imported into America, has large horns and erect ears. Its fleece is called by the natives "flek."
