HOUSE BILL NO. 3.

A Bill for an Act to Create the County of Wallowa, and to fix the salaries of the County Judge and Treasurer thereof.

Be it enacted by the Legislative As-

sembly of the State of Oregon: SECTION 1. That all that portion of the State of Oregon embraced within the following boundary lines be. and the same is, hereby created and organized into a separate county by the name of Wallowa, viz: Commencing at the north-east corner of the State of Oregon on Snake river, and thence west on the State line to where it intersects Grande Ronde river; rate of ten cents per mile for every nule actually traveled in going to and up the center of said Grande Ronde river to the mouth of Wallowa river; thence in a south-westerly direction up the center of said Wallowa river to the month of the Minum river: thence SEC. 11. The county judge of Walthe mouth of the Minum river; thence in a southerly and easterly direction up the center of said Minnm river to its source on the summit of the Powder River mountains; thence following said summit divide of the Powdor River mountains in an easterly direction to a point about twenty miles due west from Suake river; thence due east to what is known as Limestone Point on the cast line of the State of Oregon; thence north following said cast line of the State of Oregon to the place

of beginning. SEC. 2. That the territory en-braced within said boundary lines shall compose a county for all civil and military purposes, and shall be subject to the same laws and restrictions, and be entitled to elect the same officers as other counties in the State; provided, that it shall be the duty of the Governor, as soon as convenient after this Act shall have become a law, to appoint for Wallowa county, and from its citizens, the several county officers allowed by law to other counties in this State, which said officers, after duly qualifying according to law, shall be entitled to hold their respective offices until their successors are duly elected at the general election of 1888 and have duly qualified according to law.

SEC. 3. The temporary county seat for Wallowa county shall be located at Joseph, in said county, until a per-manent seat is adopted. At the next general election the question of the location of a county seat shall be submitted to the legal voters of said county, and the place receiving the highest number of votes shall be the perma-

nent county seat of said county. SEC. 4. The legal voters of Wal-


their conclusions in duplicate with the clerks of Union and Wallows counties. Within thirty days after the filing of such report in Wallowa county, either county may appeal from the de-cision of said Board to the Curcuit court for Union county by serving a notice of appeal upon the clerk of the otler county. Upon perfecting the issues in said Circuit court, either county may demand a change of ven-ue to any other county of the Sixth Judicial District of the State of Oregon which may be agreed upon by said counties, or, in the event of their disagreement which may be designated by the judge of said district; the trial may be by jury, and the judge-ment rendered may be enforced as other judgements against counties; if the county appealing fails to receive a more favorable judgement than the finding of said Board by at least five hundred dollars, it shall pay the costs of appeal. If no appeal be taken by either county, within the thirty days above provided, the finding of said Board shall be conclusive. The per-


