brave men consented to go to the other side and brave death there. Of course it would not do to make any noise for fear the lion would be frightened away, or possibly he might frighten us, so we kept very still, which was very tiresome, but we sat bravely at our post—or log, until the daylight had all faded and darkness had settled like a pall about us, still we watched, how long we could not tell; it seemed as though the night was well along, and I had just caught a glimpse of a beautiful meteor, almost forgetting our surroundings, when one of the boys, who had the best gun, yawned, which was a signal for all the rest of us to yawn, and we thought of our safe beds in the camp, where no cougar would dare come.
Finally some one suggested that we retreat, which was unanimously seconded, and it was not long until we were blowing up the coals of the smouldering camp-fire, by whose light we discovered that we had been out until about 10 o'clock; but we were so sleepy, the next turn toward bed, but we found out that in our absence—as we were expected to hunt all night long, and had all the guns—the women had congregated in one tent for protection, and we were left out; but this would not have been so bad had they not taken most all the bedding with them, and what was worse they would not return it, so the night of our cougar hunt was one long to be remembered.

I think it was only the next night, while the whole camp was wrapped in deepest sleep, we were awakened by a most heart-rending cry, which was generally recognized as the voice of the terrible beast we had been hunting. The cry seemed to be but a few steps from camp, and what added to our horror was a moan of real distress from one of the tents. You may be sure there was great consternation as the cry rang out again and again, making the woods ring, "hoo-hoo hoo-hoo." Of course we were not afraid as far as real downright fear was concerned, but the nights here on the mountains are very cold and none of us wanted to leave our tents in a hurry, for fear of taking cold, and something must be done, for the cry of human suffering continued, as well as the cry of the beast, and it wasn't a child's cry either, or a woman's, but of a strong man; so as soon as we were satisfied that the cougar was not then in camp, we crept with the greatest caution to the troubled tent and found that one of our best and bravest men had an awful gripe in his stomach. It was not the cougar which caused his moan, but a superabundance of huckleberries, and from this same brave man we learned that the heart-rending cry we heard in the woods was the screech of an owl.
