

In Memoriam.

At the request of relatives and friends of the late Mrs. Emery, we publish the following address read at her funeral, and a poem to her memory, both written by her husband, Mr. H. C. Emery.

Friends and neighbors:—We have convened here today for the purpose of paying the last respects to one of our fellow mortals, and to take the last look upon one who has been known to many of you, has suffered with disease for a number of years. The change has come and she has passed on to another state of existence. Although we are yet permitted for a moment to look upon the form before us, we know it is only the empty casket for the jewel it contained is no longer there. The life principle that for a time animated and moved the form has ceased to hold control, and has left it and gone forth into a more beautiful home where pain does not trouble and where it can enjoy the fullness of life for which it was being prepared while it had been acting and sojourning in its earthly form.

I will now give you a short history of her life. Her name was Mary Arretta Ann Waters. She was born August 22, 1825, in Loudon county, Virginia. At an early age her parents moved to Ohio and settled in Marion county. When she was about thirteen years old, by the influence of friends, she was baptized and joined a Christian church there, known as Campbellite. But as yet her mind was void of an understanding of the doctrines of the church she was connected with. The minister, by whom she was baptized, was named Adam Little. She with him had many conversations concerning a future state of existence which finally led her to adopt a belief in no after life, and that death to the form was the final ending to all life. Yet she and Adam Little promised each other that whichever one passed away first, and finding existence still, would, if possible, communicate to the other while in this life remaining. At the age of eighteen she married her yet surviving husband. Two children were born unto them. The first died at the age of six years; the second at the age of three years. She and her husband bade these children farewell never again expecting to learn or to know of them more. She was then left childless, but in the spring of 1851, while she and her husband were eating their meal one morning, she became suddenly strangely influenced and became entranced. While in the trance the spirit of Adam Little communicated with her husband, and also both of her children. After she came out of the trance she was asked if she recollecting anything that transpired while she was in the trance. She said she saw and talked with Adam Little and with both of her children. That and following circumstances thoroughly convinced her that though we pass through the valley and shadow of death we are not dead, and until the hour of her departure she firmly believed that which is called death is only a change to a higher and more beautiful sphere of existence.

Oh! we see our friends are going, Going from our sight away, Passing through death's gloomy shadow Shall we bid good-bye for aye?

Must we say good-bye forever? Must our hopes all blighted be? Oh! will death all love ties sever? Will we ne'er those loved ones see?

Hark! M thinks I hear some whisper From that far off distant shore, Saying "when you pass the shadow We shall meet and part no more."

Listen! Listen! Still I hear them, Floating gently on the air, Listen! Listen! Do not fear them; 'Tis the voice of loved ones fair.

Now we hear their voices plainly, And their voices plainly say "We are come and are not waiting 'Til your mortal forms decay."

"But you earth again we meet you, Of our joys to let you know, And oft times we hope to greet you While you journey here below."
