THE long contemplated suit to be brought against the different wagon of Defts. road and land companies and numerous corporations and individuals, to declare forfeited millions of acres of granted land in Oregon, alleged to have been obtained through fraud, has at last been begun in the United States district court at Portland by District Attorney McArthur, who has been many weeks in preparing his bills of complaint. The parties defendant 28th to plead. number eight corporations and sixtyeight individuals, and the suit promises to be one of the most vigorously contested cases in the federal courts for many years.

THE recent meetings in Salem of many reform organizations for the purpose of organizing a new party succeeded to the satisfaction of the prohibitionists. 
