

NATURAL SCULPTURES.

Scenic Beauties of the Peach Spring Canyon of the Colorado River.

We know so little of the scenic beauties of our country that every year surprises us with a new revelation. The rock sculptures of the Peach Spring canyon of the Colorado river are marvels which very few Americans have seen.

The length of the canyon is 325 miles, and the highest cliffs rise to 7,800 feet. Some of the principal ruins—this word seems to be the only word to apply to them—have been named from time to time, and for the most part with fitness. One is Solomon's Temple, another The Pyramid, another Sunset Peak, and still others The Sphinx, Westminster Abbey and The Beehive.

Solomon's Temple is considerably over a mile high, and the denudation and wearing of the rock by water has been such that it represents an enormous pile of architecture, with sculptured bastions, harmonious in its proportions, with great terraces at its base, and growing smaller toward the top. At the very top, in the center, is a pyramidal peak in exact proportions. This sculptured pile is from two to four miles across the facade, and to see these things standing up against the clear, cloudless blue of the Arizona sky, produces an indescribable effect.

Sunset Peak goes up like a dome 6,000 feet, and when the sun sets clear and has entirely disappeared behind the mountains, its reflected light rests on the topmost peak and transforms it into a minaret of gold—a heavenly light, indeed.

Another architectural piece goes by the name of Habel's Tower, and is 5,000 feet high, and this has beautiful sculptured buttresses. The Castle on the Rhine is the same height.

The Pyramid is 4,200 feet above the river, and the river is 1,130 feet above the sea.

Some of these cliffs of even terraces and strata rise almost perpendicularly to a height of 2,500 feet, and as high up as the eye can detect, a variety of plants, including cacti, perch and thrive in the crevices. Some varieties of flowers bloom the year round in the canyon, so mild is the temperature, even in mid-winter.

Of course it is impossible for any visitor to appreciate the magnitude of this scene of ruin and desolation. The chimney on the top of a perfect pyramid, that was sixty feet by actual measurement, looks to be the size of an ordinary chimney.

The full beauty of Westminster Abbey, and its likeness to its venerable, ivy-grown namesake, is very striking, only it is a far more wonderful structure.

Just before reaching it, and on the same side of the canyon, is the Temple of Jupiter, and it is unquestionably one of, if not the finest parts of the canyon. It is a mighty pile of stupendous harmony and sculpturing, the central facade bearing a multitude of sphinxes and classical images.

On the opposite side is "Moses Striking the Rock," the outline of the great statue at one point being very life-like.

On the top of one cliff is The Prophet at Prayer—a kneeling figure with outstretched hands; and there are many features not yet named awaiting christening from the gladden and acute visitors yet to come.—The Golden Days.

TRIUMPHS OF INVENTION.

They Are Due to Hard Work Stimulated by a Desire for Wealth.

The traditions of great discoveries that have come by chance are, for the most part, myths. True, a lucky accident may occasionally give a hint to an inventive mind that will help towards a long-contemplated consummation, but such an occurrence is only a link in a chain of circumstances all tending to a common end. Sir Isaac Newton got such a hint in his philosophical researches, when, on a certain occasion, he noted the falling of an apple. He had seen many apples fall before that time, no doubt, and no day of his previous life could have passed without presenting to his sight similar occurrences, having the same relation to the object of his study. But that particular apple happened to fall and be noticed by him just when his study of the greatest of all philosophical problems had reached the right point to make the object lesson valuable. Tradition gives another alleged accident, the familiar story of the kettle, as the turning point in the discovery or invention of the steam engine, but he who studies the life and works of James Watt will find that there was nothing accidental in the kettle accident. It was but a link in the long chain, all of whose links he wrought by patient toil.

All the great triumphs of invention that are now employed as factors in human progress have reached their present development by successive steps. The telegraph of Edison's time, although like that of Morse in its general features, is very unlike that in detail, and in the manner of operating it. A single invention of Edison, not by any means an accident, quadrupled the capacity of all the wires strung, or thereafter to be strung. The engines that drive great ships across the Atlantic in less than six days are the result of the work of successive generations of brainy men. Millions have been lost in experiments, change has followed change, one improvement has succeeded another, until the marine engine of our time bears little resemblance to that of thirty years ago. Go into the pressroom of a great newspaper, and see the printing machines at work, and you see the results of hundreds of inventions, the progress of generations. Accident had nothing to do with it. All has come from work, work of the best brains, stimulated by the desire to get fame and fortune.—Inventive Age.

THE WORLD'S MAIL.

Interesting Statistics Regarding the Work of One Year.

An industrious statistician has been collecting figures relating to the postal business of the entire world for the year of 1886. He develops some very surprising and impressive facts, in which, however, it is exceedingly hard for the ordinary mind to follow him. It is easy to read, for instance, that in the year 1886 the people of the civilized world sent almost 6,000,000,000 of letters, more than 1,000,000,000 of postal cards, nearly 5,000,000,000 of newspapers and more than 100,000,000 of merchandise packages, making in all nearly 13,000,000,000 of mail parcels. But who can possibly realize the meaning of such figures?

We can easily follow our statistician, however, when he proceeds to show us what regions of the world make the largest use of their mail facilities in proportion to their population.

America, with a very much smaller population than the continent of Europe, sends more than half as many mail packages as the whole of Europe. The figures are a little upward of 7,000,000,000 for Europe and almost 4,000,000,000 for America.

Asia sends but a comparatively small number, and Africa a smaller number still—less than one mail package in a year to every seven inhabitants of the continent.

How great a contrast is presented by the case of Australia, where 24 letters, cards, papers and parcels are sent on an average to every inhabitant annually! Australia, indeed, makes the largest use of its mail facilities of any continent on the globe.

To circulate the world's mail matter no fewer than 500,000 persons are employed, and this matter is distributed from more than 150,000 post-offices, of which about one-third are in the United States.—Minneapolis Journal.

CANADIAN ASBESTOS.

How It is Mined and the Prices It Commands in the Market.

Mining is carried on by cutting down the hills of asbestos-bearing serpentine, much as a farmer cuts down a stack of hay or straw, or by open quarrying on the level. The rock is blasted out, and the asbestos, separated from the containing rock, is "cobbled"—i. e., separated by hammering from adhering foreign matter. This "cobbling" is a comparatively easy matter in the case of the finer quality, as it usually separates readily from the gangue, but in the lower grades much difficulty is experienced in separating the fibrous matter from the non-fibrous. At best there is great waste. Much of the asbestos is in thin or narrow veins, and is wasted, as by the present mode of operating it does not pay to separate this from the serpentine. A machine that will enable these narrow veins to be utilized is a desideratum.

When "cobbled," the asbestos is graded according to purity, color and length of fiber into three grades and bagged for shipment. The finest quality or "firsts" finds ready sale at prices ranging from \$80 to \$110 per ton; "seconds" fetch from \$50 to \$70 per ton; while "thirds" may be valued at \$13 to \$15 per ton. In good mines the yield of asbestos is from three to five per cent. of the rock quarried, and the cost of mining may be put down at \$25 to \$30 per ton. Returns obtained by the Geological Survey of Canada show that for the year 1888, Canada's output was 4,494 tons, valued at the mines at \$255,000, and this the output of nine different mines. Over three-fourths of the whole was shipped to the United States; small quantities going to Great Britain, Germany, France, Belgium and Italy, and being used in domestic manufacturing.
