County Court.

Road petitioned for by J. W. Kimbrell et al; motion to set aside order of court dismissing remonstrance allowed and said order heard at this term of court, April 8, 1891; viewers report read first time April 8, 1891; remonstrance dismissed April 9, 1891; Robert Shaw, Alex Jones and John Blize appraisers to meet at Union, April 18, 1891.

Road petitioned for by J. E. Yowell et al; unfavorable report, dismissed. In the matter of improvements on county jail; continued for term and set for hearing Wednesday, May 6, 1891.

In the matter of petition of the citizens of Elgin for appropriation on the road east of Elgin; continued for term.

Road petitioned for by N. J. Baker et al; declared a public highway. In the matter of petition of W. B. Sargent to have money returned heretofore inadvertently paid in on estray; money refunded.

Road petitioned for by Lou Mahaffey in her own right; J. R. Kellogg, George Ackles and Tom Smith appointed viewers and J. L. Curtis, surveyor, to meet Saturday April 25, 1891.

Road petitioned for by J. C. Oliver et al; report read first time April 8th; remonstrance overruled April 9, 1891, on claim for damages. Wm. Woodell, Thomas Wade and Ed Rinehart appointed appraisers to meet at Alieon Saturday, April 18, 1891.

Road petitioned for by James Farley et al; declared a public highway.

Road petitioned for by D. M. Tarter et al; declared a public highway; \$1500 appropriated on condition that a sufficient amount is raised in other ways to complete the road.

In the matter of the Catherine creek improvement; continued for term.

Road petitioned for by E. W. Imbler et al; ordered opened.

Road petitioned for by Rudolph Hug, James Riggs and George McDonald; Jacob Hug, Frank Earney and J. Bright appointed viewers and J. L. Curtis, surveyor, to meet at road on Monday, April 27th.

Road petitioned for by Jos. Hartley et al; Robert Gibson, Charles Howell and C. T. Wise appointed viewers and J. L. Curtis, surveyor, to meet at New Bridge on Saturday April 18, 1891.

In the matter of the resignation of W. B. Sargent as justice of the peace; accepted and his bondsmen exonerated from further liability.

In the matter of distribution of road funds; \$100 appropriated to each road supervisor who files his bond and has qualified and final distribution held over till May term.

In the matter of tax roll; sheriff turned over the roll to court, but was returned back with instructions to collect taxes up to May 1, 1891, without cost to the taxpayers.

In the matter of Union road district; the corporate limits of the city of Union shall constitute road district number 45 and E. F. In the matter of appointing road supervisors as deputy sheriffs; clerk instructed to write out appointments for the sheriff to appoint all road supervisors special deputy sheriffs for the purpose of collecting road tax.

In the matter of bonds of road supervisors; each road supervisor instructed to file a good and sufficient bond in the sum of \$300.

In the matter of a scholarship to the state agricultural college; Philip Alger appointed.

In the matter of J. H. Smith's tax; sheriff instructed to collect the same and the county guarantees to stand all costs adjudged against him.

Road petitioned for by James Huff et al; James H. Norton, J. H. Cowan and John Graham, Jr., appointed viewers and J. L. Curtis, surveyor, to meet at Norton's house, April 28, 1891.

Liquor license granted to David Beveridge of North Powder for the term of one year.

In the matter of salary of the school superintendent; it was ordered that the salary of school superintendent be increased to \$1000 per year provided that he keep an office at the county seat and devote his whole time to the schools of the county.

J. Smith presented an affidavit that he had paid to A. N. Hamilton his taxes for the year 1888, which is still on the delinquent tax roll, and asked that it be stricken from the roll.

H. Eastman admitted to the county poor house as a pauper.

A settlement was made with the treasurer and a large amount of warrants cancelled.
