The diphtheria is breaking out in Walls Walla.

The fish ladder bill has been passed by Gov. Thayer's veto.

The corner stone of the L. O. O. F. temple was laid on Sept. 28th at Astoria, with the imposing ceremonies of the order, Past Grand Master I. W. Case officiating and E. C. Holden, chief patriarch of Ocean encampment, No. 13, delivering the oration.
