



Precious Stones In the United States.

Draw Precious Stones In the United States.

Up to the present time there has been very little mining for precious or semiprecious stones in the United States, and then only at irregular periods. It has been carried on during the past few years at Paris, Ma. near Los Cerrillos. N. M. in Alexander county. N. C., from 1881 until 1888, and on the Missouri river, near Helena, Mon., since the beginning of 1890. True beryls and garacts have been frequently found as a byproduct in the mining of mica, especially in Virginia and North Carolina. Some gems, such as the chlorastrolites, thomsonites and agates of Lake Superior are gathered on beaches, where they have fallen from rock which has gradually disintegrated by weathering and wave action. Mr George F Kunz, in his recent report on the mineral industries in the United States, says that a very limited number of diamonds have been found in the United States. They are met with in well defined districts of California, North Carolina, tieorgia and recently in Wisconsin, but up to the present time the discoveries have been rare and purely accidental. Their occurrence is chiefly confined to a belt of country lying along the east flank of the southern Alleghanies from Virginia to Georgia, and another along the western bases of the Sierra Nevada and the Cascade ranges, in northern California and south ern Oregon. The corundum gems, sapphire, ruly, oriental emerald, etc., have been found in only two states, North Carolina and Montana, and then never in fine gems. Tourmaline has been found for the past 60 years at Mount Mica, Paris, Me., in magnificent crystals, which have furnished some gems rivaling any ever found.
