



Postal Changes.

You might think we meant postoffice changes, but we do not. We intend merely to make some slight mention of the changes recommended by ex-Postmaster tor. General Wanamaker in the United

He would like to see United States post al telegraphs, telephones and postal savings depositories. With the buildings clerks, etc., already at the disposal of gov ernment, in his judgment the postal telegraph feature could be added in such a way that the department could even draw a small profit from it. The stamp system could be employed. When one mazoo to Shawmagunk, he could step to the drug store, buy a postal telegraphi stamp, write his message, put the stamp box. The carrier would come along next mail delivery, take the message to the first postoffice or postoffice station, where it would be sent at once. This seems to b

about Mr. Wanamaker's idea. He believes that the government should rent the use of telegraphic lines from existing companies as it now rents the post sent in the same way where necessary o desirable. Mr. Wanamaker thinks that Sent by mail on receipt of price by C. a contract could be made with the com-I. But immediately on these rates being made of course all the people would use the postal telegraph, and the result would presently be government

ownership of the telegraphs. Another change recommended is that of allowing the postoffices to be places of deposit for small savings, giving the depositor a rate of interest amounting to t per cent less than that paid by saving inks. When the sum deposited by an individual amounted to enough to afford an investment, it should be withdrawn, The postal savings should be sent to the secretary of the treasury and would afford a great fund on which the government could draw in case of emergency and "would make it unnecessary to keep a huge surplus in the treasury." From which it will be seen that the ex-post

master general is inclined to adopt the views of the Nationalist party. Finally he would have the parcels post enlarged in its facilities and cheapened as to its rates. The great express and telegraph companies are of course dead against Mr. Wanamaker's plan.
