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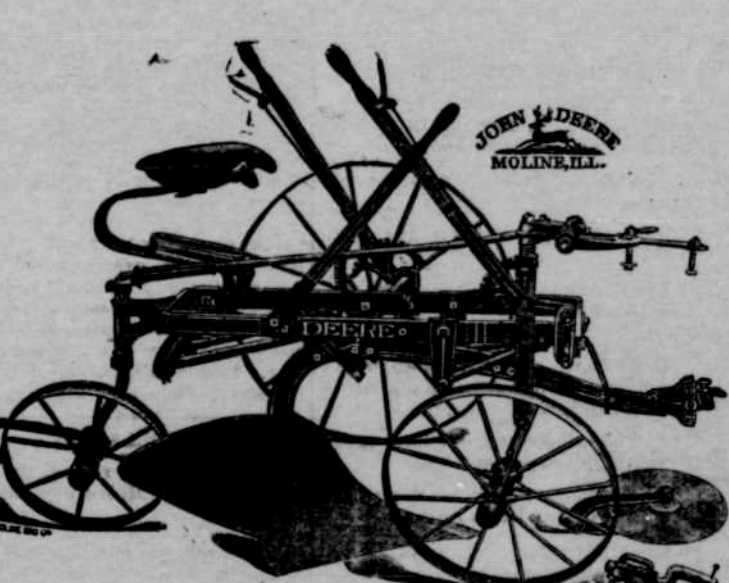
IT IS THE WORLD'S WORST AFFLICTION AT PRESENT.
The Only Way of Securing to Each Man His Honest Share of the Earth's Wealth - Workingmen Warned Against Stump Speakers.

Something rather significant took

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place at the recent Chicago Labor day celebration. One of our most prominent politicians in his speech there allowed himself to play the reformer by uttering the following high sounding generalization: "Let us strive to make the conditions of life such that as nearly as possible each man shall receive the share he is honestly entitled to and no more." Yet that man stands squarely by the very industrial system, tooth and nail, which gives to about 10,000 families in this nation, his own included, not less than 300 times to each as much as we allow the average working family to get. The same system gives to about 200 families out of 10,000 the power to obtain from 2,000 to over 10,000 times

as much as honest labor receives in a general average for the whole nation. And we know positively by the best historical data at hand that at no previous historical period could the perversion of men attain such an intense degree of dishonesty in wealth distribution. And can anybody point to us any evil deeper and more fatal than that dishonesty?

There is not a single charge against which most men protest in such dire indignation as at that of personal dishonesty. They all seem to feel that to be the worst evil for men to be guilty of, the one that will make any individual most repulsive to the community at large. Social dishonesty must then represent the darkest social evil, the one which shall evolve greater social disasters, and if we have attained the greatest intensity in that evil that society and history can record then we are really in a bad fix.

The politicians we have mentioned was on the lookout for signs from the workers when he used that generalization in his speech to them about the need of honesty in wealth distribution as the supreme social object with every one of us as the basis of the civilization. Was the fundamental concept of every social unit of every man who wants to be more than a human monkey shut up in the narrow, mean cage of selfish personal desires, as most men are, unfortunately. If it had not always been so with the wise more than with the ignorant as a whole, we would have long ago solved the problems that today more than ever imperiously demand from us a rapid and substantial solution.

But why should the workers of today care for any politician or for the realization of your grand political ideal? Even the devil can quote the Bible. Even the worst and most perverse politician can proclaim the need of fair play and honesty, and freedom and all that in the adjustments of the social organism. Talk is very cheap when limited to vague allusions on human duty. When dealing with each other on important subjects, we all need to be planned down to specific details and conditions, with no vagaries about them, with no double meaning words, but must go to the bottom facts of human conduct, down into the clearest precepts of honesty and moral law, leaving no escape to selfishness, personal or collective, individual or social, private or public. All else is a mere play of words with which to cheat men iniquity by wild rhapsodies on righteousness, with no special proof for the suppression of iniquity, for the establishment of righteousness and truth.

If one worker may give advice to the other workers of this nation and all nations, it would be: "Please don't listen to any professional politicians. They will lumbag you in the future as they have done in the past. Give them the cold shoulder. Don't patronize their papers. Abandon them to their masters, the aristocrats and plutocrats of nations. Choose your own political leaders and instructors from among men with clean records, men who don't long for offices with high salaries, men who don't get fat and keep fat through the barbarisms of our industrial inferno, men who give you specific remedies for our social disease, men who know how to reverse effects by reversing causes, and never men who cling to the past and present causes with which past and present iniquities have grown and nourished."

Yes, honesty in wealth distribution is the grand object to strive for, but it should be done through basic, simple, scientific principles, with no lumbag about them. **Simple Pasteurizing.** The work being done at the Wisconsin Experiment station in pasteurizing milk and cream for public use and sending the same to patrons as far away as Chicago suggests a new and profitable occupation for women, as it is by no means a difficult process, says Mary Wager-Fisher in The American Agriculturist. It can be done by independent householders, providing the temperature is maintained at the right point and ice can be had for rapid cooling. The process consists of heating the milk in closed flasks or fruit jars to a temperature of 150 degrees F., holding it there for 20 minutes, and quickly cooling. The milk should be less than 12 hours old; the fresher the better presumably. Every housekeeper knows how to cook the contents in closed glass jars - by standing them on a board in the bottom of a vessel partly filled with water and closely covering the same. This method is claimed to kill at least 99 per cent of the bacteria. Being done in closed vessels, there is no marked escape of gases. Milk that is separated, and the cream well, is purer than when set to rise in cream in the old time way, because the centrifugal force of the separator drives impurities, including microbes, to the walls of the separator, where they adhere. As the sterilization of milk is found to be so unsatisfactory for continued use, this method of pasteurization is very important.

CARL SCHURZ TO GAGE.

Secretary Charged With Spreading False Alarms.
HIS MOTIVE PURELY POLITICAL.
Under Cloak of Protecting Creditors He Misuses His High Office - Mr. Schurz Points Out That the Republican Party Can Remedy Defects in Present Monetary Laws.

Carl Schurz has issued an open letter to Lyman J. Gage, secretary of the treasury, in which he takes the latter to question in regard to his reported interview of Aug. 28. In this interview, Mr. Gage sought to alarm business interests by suggesting that William J. Bryan, if elected, could direct his secretary of the treasury to pay off in silver all government obligations payable in "coin." Mr. Schurz practically charges Mr. Secretary Gage with having given out his interview for a political purpose under cloak of protecting creditors of the government. Mr. Schurz's letter is as follows:

Dear Sir - The newspapers of Aug. 28 published an interview with you in which you were quoted as saying that "there is no doubt Mr. Bryan, if elected, would order the secretary of the treasury to make payment in silver of all the public debt payable in coin and for all current disbursements of the government as well, which amount to from \$1,000,000 to \$1,700,000 per day, and that he would give such an order, too, if very certain, if he is in the same mind that he was in 1893." You went on to say that although Mr. Bryan "would have great difficulty in doing this in time, as the mere announcement of such a purpose would stop the inflow of gold and correspondingly increase payments into the treasury of silver and silver certificates," that you had practically put the government on a silver basis, ruin its credit and bring incalculable disaster upon the business interests of the country.

Having for a great many years taken a deep and somewhat active interest in the establishment of a sound monetary system in the United States, I may without impropriety address to you a few remarks in reply to your public statement. I emphatically deny, Mr. Secretary, that I engaged in such a conversation with you, and that any president will be able to do what you say might be done unless the Republican party in control of the government in both its legislative and executive branches prove itself utterly dishonest in its professed purpose to maintain the gold standard.

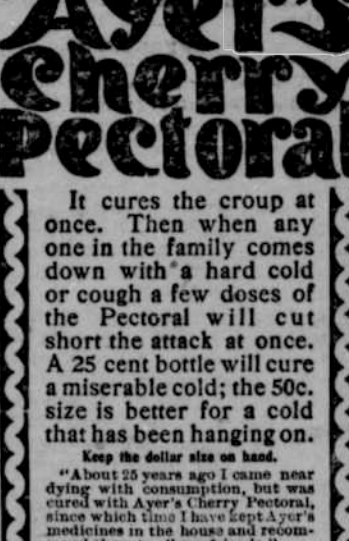
The denial is based upon the reasoning of those of your critics who seek to show by figures that a president desiring ever so much to put the country upon a silver basis would lack the means for doing so. On the contrary, for argument's sake, I will accept all you say on that point, but you omit to mention a fact of decisive importance. If the executive, as you say, professes the disinterest of "paying silver in settlement of all interest on the public debt not specifically payable in gold and making its daily disbursements to its creditors in silver," it is owing to a law in the currency law passed by the Republican party, a law which, as the spokesman of the Republican party promised, was to put the gold standard upon an impregnable basis. It was suggested at the time by some of its critics that the law was purposely so manipulated by Republican politicians in the senate as to leave the possibility of the substitution of the gold standard for the silver standard open in order to enable the Republican party in the present presidential campaign to say that the election of a Republican president was absolutely necessary to save the gold standard and to prevent default of the government.

HOLDING BACK MILK.
Cows Are Nervous and Must Be Carefully Handled.
According to Professor Stewart, the following is the explanation why cows sometimes hold up or keep back their milk. The production of milk is due to a nervous action of the glandular substance of the udder is broken down into milk whenever the cow is influenced by sufficient excitement of the right kind. It depends upon the structure and function of the udder just as much as the sections of other glands do, which we know a wholly subject to a set of nerves controlling this distinct function. The udder is not a mere vessel for holding milk that is supposed to be secreted continually and gathers in the udder, as one may suppose a constant dripping of any fluid would fill any other receptacle. On the contrary, it is a gland, made up of cellular substance, which grows by separation from the blood of the matter required. When it has attained maturity, or when the necessary nervous action occurs, it breaks down into a special product - milk.

Several experiments have been made with the udders of cows in milking condition that have been slaughtered, and an examination is recorded of the udder of a cow accidentally killed on the railroad when going home to be milked, when she would have given the usual ten quarts. The microscope showed the minute lobules of the tissue swollen and distended, but the udder contained practically no milk, except a very small quantity that drained from the divided tissue when cut across. Let us consider what happens when we sit down to milk a cow. The milker gently rubs the udder and gently handles the teats, and this excites the maternal instinct. There is what is called an erectile action of the muscles of the milk organs. The teats become soft and loose condition of the teats change to rigidity, and in a very short time the milk flows and continues until the glandular tissue is exhausted, when the udder, previously hard and tense, becomes soft and loose.

We perceive that this function of the udder is wholly nervous in its action, as indeed every other function of the animal is, and if the due nervous excitement is absent there is no functional action. It is wholly due to the right influence on the nerves that the milk is produced and flows from every ultimate lobule of the udder down through all the ducts, small and great, to the teat. If, all goes well, and the cow is in her natural, easily excited nervous condition, as soon as the milker begins to touch the teats the cow lets down the milk - that is, she does not exert herself to oppose the action of the nerves of the mammary glands. But let the milker be rough or ill used the cow, or let the cow from any cause be stupid and willful, and this necessary motherly influence on the nerves be prevented in any way, and there is no milk. The udder may remain as tense and full apparently as usual, but not a drop of milk can be drawn until the current of the cow's mind is turned successfully to maternal desire.
