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WITHIN a month several thousand eastern people have arrived at Portland and are now hunting homes throughout the state, many of them in Polk county. We have in this county a large area of good land that is unproductive and therefore unprofitable. If industrious and thrifty people were encouraged to buy it at a fair price and improve it, it would be better for the seller, the buyer, and the county at large. Too many people among us own more than they ever will or perhaps could put to good use. Let us welcome the strangers and induce them to remain among us and help add to the general prosperity. If you have land to sell let it be generally known so that intending purchasers can be cited to you.

SAN FRANCISCO.

After hearing all that one may about California and its metropolis, he must see to it fully realize her peculiarities. Both will fall below his expectations in some things and excel them in others. The state is a series of contrasts between extra fine things to those that are below mediocrity. San Francisco is in many respects an interesting place. The temperature throughout the year ranges between fifty and sixty degrees. The fog and cold winds are sometimes very disagreeable, yet there is much pleasant weather. Prosperity reigns and there is a rush of business. Market street is the great central avenue toward which numerous electric and cable car lines converge and for a mile from the foot of it a stranger could hardly cross between the steady stream of vehicles and street cars going in all directions. A number of policemen are constantly employed helping people to get across that street. The most thronged and busiest part of Portland is tame as compared with it. There are hotels, lodging houses and restaurants without number. A majority of the population seem to be thus live. Saloons are not so conspicuous as we expected and the police keep outward vice well in check. There are many huge and some very tall buildings. The Examiner and Chronicle buildings are each nine stories high, but we ascended to the eighth story of the Call structure and looked down upon them. A dozen great market houses in different parts of the city supply every possible want in the eating line, and several different department stores there are as big as all three in Portland. The local demand for fruit seemed far less than we had anticipated. Many stores are devoted entirely to the sale of flowers and shrubs. A large per cent of those doing business in the city live in suburban towns and the local trains do an immense passenger business. There are twelve trains each way daily over the fifty miles of road between there and San Jose, and four very large passenger ferry boats leave the foot of Market street, one every 15 minutes for Oakland and adjacent towns. In the morning the great tide of humanity is toward San Francisco and at evening the other way. Golden Gate park with its 1,000 acres of attractions will charm one for hours, and the noted Cliff House with its hundreds of seats crawling over the small rocky island only a few hundred yards seaward, once seen will never be forgotten. The Presidio, the government post where Uncle Sam always keeps many soldiers and where so many thousands of our soldier boys have sojourned, is a far more attractive place than many would imagine. This is a mere inkling of what may be seen in and around the city.

It is improbable that Prof. Sanders will remain as principal of the Independence public school for another year, as he has better offers from elsewhere.
