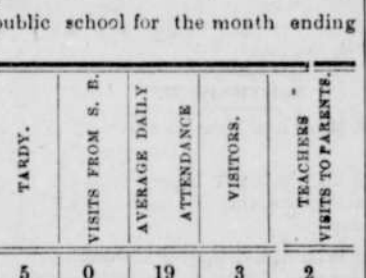

PLANTS IN WINDOWS.
How to Keep Them Thrifty Under Various Conditions.
Plants must be treated as individuals. No two can be handled in exactly the same manner, affirms Meehan's Monthly in presenting some points of successful plant culture in windows. But few persons realize what a small amount of soil is made to support a plant and how inadequate the nourishment must frequently be. Food of some kind should be occasionally added to the soil. Manure in liquid form will aid strong growth. A few drops of household ammonia frequently added to water is a good practice. Potash, present in wood ashes or bone meal, will sometimes be acceptable.
Plants in a very hot room sometimes suffer from a dry atmosphere, and the leaves should be lightly syringed occasionally.
Dead or dying leaves on a plant are useless incumbrances and should be removed and destroyed as soon as they appear.

ly effective in decorative work. Sometimes as many as 150 to 200 flowers are borne on one spike, a remarkable product from so small a plant. It requires little room in a house, doing well in a basket suspended from the roof of the greenhouse, and can be grown in a comparatively cool place. VINE GRAFTING.
Texts of Various Styles of Grafts and Other Important Points.
Results of experiments in bench grafting resistant vines have recently been reported from the California experiment station. The experiments included tests of the relative value of English and Champin grafts, leaving two eyes on the scions and leaving only one, preliminary callusing in sand, planting out in the nursery immediately after grafting and callusing in straw covered with sand. The cuttings used varied from one-fourth to one-half inch in diameter and were from six to nine inches long. The lower cut was made through the knot of the bud and the last internode of the upper end left as long as possible. All the buds on the stock were carefully removed, a deep cut being made in order to remove the adventitious buds at the base of the grafts.

Scions were prepared in a similar way, except that the buds were left. The scions having only one eye were cut through the second knot in order to leave the eye protected by a closed internode. With the scions having two eyes the upper cut was made about an inch above the second bud eye. Care was taken to prevent the drying out of the cuttings and afterward of the grafts.
End to end grafting as originated in France was practiced in some instances. The number of successful grafts obtained by this method was low, but those that did unite made excellent unions. In grafting by this method the ends of stock and scion are cut at an angle of about 70 degrees and held in place by a piece of galvanized wire, which is pushed into the pith of each piece.
The proportion of successful Champin grafts was slightly greater than that of the English cleft. The successful English cleft grafts, however, were considerably superior to the other in the matter of completeness and strength of union.



How to Make Mayonnaise Dressing.
Mix together one teaspoonful of mustard, one teaspoonful of powdered sugar, one-half teaspoonful of salt and one-quarter of a teaspoonful of cayenne; add the yolks of two raw eggs and stir well with a wooden spoon. Add about a pint of olive oil, straining it in a few drops at a time until the mixture thickens. About two tablespoonfuls of lemon juice will be required for this quantity of dressing; this to be stirred in gradually to thin the mixture as it becomes too thick. Then lemon juice and oil should be dropped in alternately to give it the right consistency. Add last two tablespoonfuls of vinegar and mix thoroughly. Sometimes, when the dressing is served, a half cupful of whipped cream is added to the mixture.

How to Improve the Complexion.
A little lemon juice taken in cold water every morning before breakfast is the best kind of a medicine for the woman whose complexion is dull and yellow and dead. It acts upon the skin by correcting the disorders of the liver. What folly for a girl to dab cosmetics in her face in the hope of ridding it of its "sallery" cast when a bad liver is at the root of the trouble!

How to Cure Mange.
A sure cure for the mange is two drops of Fowler's solution of arsenic every other morning for three mornings; skip two mornings and then give three drops every other morning for six mornings. Give to each cat separately in a little milk. This will cure the worst case. Many animals, including horses, have been cured.

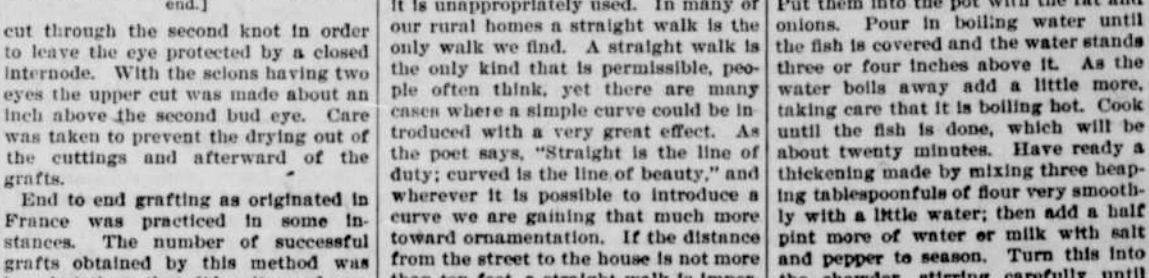
How to Improve a Stew.
When a savory stew is made and there are bits of bread to dispose of, let the housewife try the rich effect of sippets in her stew. First she gets her bits of stale bread and cuts them into small pieces, which are fried in butter, then slipped into the stew. They mingle with the gravy richly and are delicious to eat.

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A New Drummond Phlox.
The London correspondent of American Gardening notes a new kind of drummond phlox (Hepphoid's) of dwarf and more compact growth than the ordinary forms of the large flowering phlox drummondii. It has remarkable decorative value. Beds of the type as represented by its varieties are very gay indeed. The type appears to be well adapted for culture in pots, and some singularly dwarf growing varieties have also been obtained.

Plant breeding, the making of new things from old, just now greatly occupies the attention of skillful horticulturists.
Fully 90 per cent of the date palms introduced in recent years from Africa are now growing vigorously in Arizona and southern California.
The greenhouse leaf tyer, an insect pest of violets, roses and other plants, can be controlled in greenhouses by handpicking or trimming away and destroying all infested leaves or other portions of plants.

FISH CHOWDER.
