Dairy Creamery

Nearly all farmers have cows. Their collective possessions in the bovine line comprehend every kind of cow from the poorest to the best—pure bred, cross bred and "any old breed." A farmer's cow is a cow which belongs to a farmer, and that is about the only general definition of the term. "A farmer's cow" is not any particular breed of cow or type of cow. Nevertheless the expression has been so long applied to any sort of cow that no one else will have that it becomes suggestive of a second rate scrub. Why such a cow should be dubbed a "farmer's cow" any more than some other body's cow is the result of the notion that the farmer only needs a cow that will drop a big calf, give a little milk a little while, then get fat and be made into beef.

SOILING DAIRY CATTLE.

This was the topic of Dr. Voorhees of New Jersey at the Pennsylvania dairy meeting. He said in part that comparing forage crops on the ton basis is erroneous, as frequently a crop of medium tonnage will show more actual feeding value than one of much heavier tonnage. At the New Jersey station their first soiling crop in spring is rye sown thickly to get more stalks and leaves. They begin cutting rye just before it shows heads and feed for eight to ten days. The rye season can be somewhat extended by making early, medium and late sowings, they having fed rye for twenty-one days by this plan. Rye and wheat for soiling are top dressed with manure or nitrogenous fertilizer.

Water Clocks in China.

In the history of the Tang dynasty it is stated that in Persia at the same period there was a chrydron on a terrace near the palace formed of a balance containing twelve metal balls, one of which fell every hour on a bell and thus struck the hours correctly.
