Miss Bell has been staying with Mrs. Bird while the men are away with the thresher.

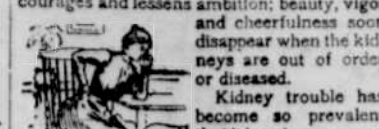
