

Great hopes are being raised, says the London World, by some recent experiments concerning the cure of th dust unisance. Already in America and in the neighborhood of Paris prolonged trials have been made of crude petroleum instead of water for sprinkling country roads, the effect, after sufficient and careful application, be-ing to consolidate and bind the surface. In this country some tests of a similar nature are about to be undertaken. and an even more promising scheme has been proposed by the surveyor of the county of Nottingham. He has found that by saturating furnace sing with gas tar before it is rolled into the road the surface so formed is waterproof and dustproof and much more durable. It therefore seems most likely that a cheaper as well as a better road will be made from slag thus treated than from the crude material. Some cure must be found for the inereasing evil, as the cloud of dust

which arises behind even a moderately driven motor car is defiling to every user of the road and a menace to health and safety.
