### HERMAN AND REAMES.

Liberally minded and conservative men who can look beyond party for public good, always give their influence toward the promotion of the best man. Both men now up for congress have made public records by which they can be and should be judged. In Southern Oregon where Mr. Reames has always lived, no republican has ever criticized his official or private record, and there is not a single blot on his character. As a public servant he has been honest, earnest and successful, and has demonstrated that he is capable of making a good congressman, who would look after every interest of his state. His future should be judged by his past and so should that of Mr. Herman. Let us see if he has ever done anything unworthy of a public official. In 1871 he was appointed receiver of the Roseburg land office for a term of four years, but at the end of two years was dismissed for procuring public land contrary to law. Neither he nor his friends pretend to show that he was guilty in the matter. He tried to keep his mouth shut on that point, and they say in substance that as a republican he must be elected regardless of his record. Possibly it may be said that an occurrence of 30 years ago should not now be brought up. Very well, then let us come up to things of recent date. For months past there had been friction in the general land office of which he was commissioner. The government made a searching inquiry into the case and the result was that Mr. Herman had to drop out in favor of a man supposed to be more capable and more inclined to look after the interests of the country at large rather than partially to his own section, and his personal friends. Either he deserved retirement or superior officials treated him unjustly. If the former, it is now discredited for him and his followers to as much as possible avoid probing into and discussing the matter. If the latter, it could be proven, for all the facts elicited are matters of record with which he is perfectly familiar and which he could quickly lay before the voters of this congressional district. Naturally he and his supporters are bringing out in the campaign everything considered to his advantage, and the very fact of their trying to ignore that land office middle is evidence that the more it was stirred up the worse it would be for him. After being twice over condemned as a public official, are the conservative voters of the district inclined to give him still another trial. No man in Oregon knows better the official record of Scott and it is very noticeable that the Oregonian strictly refrains from giving him editorial endorsement.
