NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT by virtue of an execution issued out of the circuit court of the state of Oregon for the county of Marion, bearing date the 10th day of November, 1903, upon a judgment duly entered and docketed in the clerk's office of said court on the 5th day of November, 1896, in a certain action then pending in said court in favor of W. K. Hancock, the plaintiff in said action, and against R. Reid and Frances A. Reid, the defendants therein, upon which judgment there is now due and unpaid the sum of \$79.26, with interest thereon from the 25th day of January, 1897, at the rate of 10 per cent per annum, and directed to me, the sheriff of Polk county, I did, on the 11th day of November, 1903, duly levy upon all the right, title and interest which the defendant, Frances A. 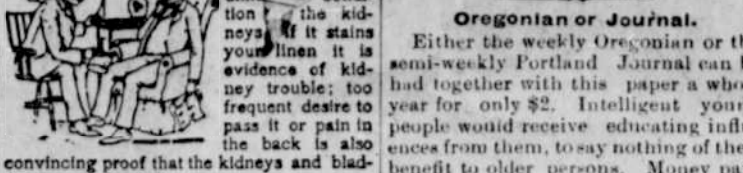
