Concerning this trouble, which is caused by an outside germ which gets into the milk after it is drawn, Professor Farrington recommends the following:
The best way to overcome this trouble is to carefully wash the cow's udder and brush her legs, afterward drying both with a clean towel; then the milk-er should wash his hands, thoroughly steam the pail into which he milks and, after throwing away the first stream of milk drawn, milk the cow with dry hands into this clean pail. The milk should be protected as carefully as possible from dust and then strained into the cans in which it is to be transported or in which it is set for cream rising. The strain-cloth, carrying cans and separator, if one is used, should be given an extra washing and scalding in order to destroy any of these germs which have been the cause of the rosy milk. There is no doubt that this trouble may be overcome in this way, and the success one has in doing it will depend entirely on how carefully he protects the milk from the germs, which must get into the milk after it is drawn from the cow.
No Process Butter in Canada.
The Dominion parliament has passed a bill making it illegal to manufacture process butter in Canada. It is said Hon. Sidney Fisher, minister of agriculture, who fathered the measure, claimed that the manufacturers of the process butter exported to other countries and that its sale in other countries would injure the Canadian trade in good butter. He is of the opinion that Canadian dairy products are bound to reach a high standard in England and that if Canadians wish to capture that market a first class article will have to be produced.

Science has outwitted the balky horse, according to horsemen who were present when a new electric "whip" was tested recently at the stock yards. The first test was made on a horse which the stable man had been unable to drive for a year. The effect of the "whip" was instantaneous, the horse being only too willing to travel. Other tests were equally successful.
At the conclusion of the tests, which were viewed by more than 2,000 persons, John J. Ellsworth of the Ellsworth & McNair stables said:

How to Build a Log Fire.

The season when a good log fire is comfortable in the evenings is at hand. To make an attractive one, which does not have to be coaxed with applications of kindling wood now and then, shake out a double sheet newspaper and leave the edges loose, so that it will light easily. It will take longer to ignite if crushed and spoils the effect of the kindling wood, which is thrown loosely on the paper against the andirons. The backlog should be of the largest size the fireplace will hold. Green wood is preferable at this time of the year. It should be put close back to the wall. If it is a split log the inside should be turned toward the front. Three logs are enough to start a fire with. Give it a good start and then let it alone. Nothing is worse than a smoky, constantly poked wood fire.

Milk Paving.

Chintz Covered Walls.

An idea utilized in an out of the way attic room which had to be converted into a bedroom at the least possible expense was that of covering the walls with old fashioned chintz—not paper, but the genuine woven material. The sort chosen had a ground of cream, on which full blown roses were strewn, just the daintiest thing imaginable and costing only a few cents a yard. The room never having been used for anything but purposes of storage, there was no wooden subbase, and the chintz was hung before this was put in, so that the lower edges of each strip were concealed.

A Clever Idea.

A dish drainer was thought out by an invalid whose mind is much stronger than her body. It was so cleverly thought out that it saves at least one-third of the work—the great, great work—of dish drying. The dishes are firmly held at their lower edges in the bottom of the wire basket. They are rinsed on both sides at the same time and do not steam. There is a central basket which holds knives, forks and spoons upright, insuring perfect drainage and preventing soiling and loosening of knife handles. No pretty finger tips are scalded in hot rinsing water.

Renewing Oilcloth.

When oilcloth has been down for a few months and is losing the shiny surface it can be renewed easily, and it will last twice as long. Melt a little ordinary glue in a pint of water, letting it stand on the top of the oven till dissolved. Wash the oilcloth thoroughly and let it dry. Then at night when the traffic of the day is over go over the whole thing carefully with a flannel dipped in the glue water. Choose a dry day for it, and by morning the glue will be hard and will have put a fine gloss, as good as new, on your floor.

A Novel Pillow Cover.

A very popular variety of pillow is covered with squares cut from English and French flowered cretonne. Big bunches of flowers are printed in the center of each square, and the corners are gathered in a rounding shape, with a large cretonne covered button over the gatherers. Denim and silk pillows are treated in the same way.
