active and healthy about the Leghorn fowls, are the best of fowls, are of quiet disposition when properly managed, and are seldom infertile. For these reasons I consider the straight Leghorn a perfect animal among all the pigeon kind for squab raising.

Duck Farming.
The high price paid for duck and goose feathers recently has stimulated increased production of these fowls, yet in spite of the rapidly large profits on a duck ranch few farmers will go into the business on anything like a large scale. Duck farming is profitable only when carried on near a good market. The cost of raising ducks is estimated by the large growers, says Wallace's Farmer, at from 8 to 8 cents a pound. The Des Moines market paid 12 1/2 cents per pound for dressed ducks at Thanksgiving time, which brought the owner about 40 cents per duck with the feathers off. There are about two ounces of good feathers on every duck.

Poultry at the Big Fair.
Twelve additional varieties of poultry have been added to the grand list of the St. Louis world's fair poultry show, consisting of the following: Rose Comb Brown Leghorns in the Mediterranean class, Black Red Game bantams, Buff turkeys and the following nonstandard varieties: Gray Japanese bantams, Indian Game bantams, Jersey Blue, King of the Fowls, and Silver Pencilled Plymouth Rocks, Pea Comb Rhode Island Reds, White Crested, White Polish bearded bantams and White Javes. Several eliminations have been made in the pigeon classification because of duplication or other causes, and some classes not now complete will be enlarged.

TURKEYS ON THE FARM.
There is money in them if you can provide the proper conditions. I never have recommended that a farmer should make a specialty of any line of poultry farming, but as the turkey seems to thrive under all climate conditions, be it either a warm or cold one, and as it farms justly with insect life, the most natural and healthful food a young turkey can have why should not every farmer avail himself of this by doing away with all prejudices and keeping more turkeys writes C. E. Matteson in the Milwaukee Sentinel. We put the fowls on the farm to take up the waste or scatter grain that is always more or less at hand around the place.

Now, we should keep turkeys for the same purpose, though instead of taking up their living around the building I should be out on the range, couplins them to exist largely from the accumulations on this range. By this practice your crops are better for not having the bugs to destroy them, and at the same time you have a nice crop of turkeys to sell at Thanksgiving time that has cost you scarcely anything.

When I first started my little place in Pewaukee, I did not intend raising a turkey, for experience had taught me that it needed more than a ten acre plot of land to grow turkeys on, but the opportunity was afforded me in the way: Nearly a section of land adjoining mine being owned by an old gentleman who, not feeling able to farm it himself had rented it piecemeal until he could rent it no longer, owing to its fertility, being completely sown out, leaving the entire tract a barren plain, and yet a splendid place to raise turkeys, I availed myself of this opportunity. Some years I sold as high as \$300 worth of turkeys.

The past two years have been the worst I ever experienced in growing turkeys. I believe and know that the property of W. A. Matteson, the well known breeder and dairyman, and the past two seasons were away above the ordinary. Instead of thunderstorms we had cloudbursts, and in consequence the turkey crop was very short, bringing the market price way up in the twenties, so that turkeys were a luxury on the tables last Thanksgiving.

But I would not advise any one to give up raising them just because one or two seasons have been against them. The farmer has had a pretty hard time of it to mature a full crop of corn for

the past two seasons. Last year was also very bad on the potato crop. Well, it does not follow that they are going to quit raising corn and potatoes.

The Pigeon For Squabs.
The best variety of pigeons to keep for squab raising is the "straight" Leghorn, says William E. Rice in a bulletin issued by the agricultural department. These magnificent birds are large and healthy, are good mothers, always

When the Chevalier Is Poor.
A correspondent of Henri's Dairyman, writing from Fort Edward, N. Y., says: I would like to tell the people who have trouble with their chickens the way I manage. We run quite a fine creamery in winter and send the cream just as soon as it comes from the separator and keep it cool in a clean, sweet pail until I have enough to churn. Never freeze it or keep more than three days, then set the pail in a pan of warm water and stir it until it is 65 degrees, then add a cup of butter milk to each gallon of cream. Keep it warm beside the stove and stir every little while. In twenty-four hours it should be thick and sour enough to churn.

If the cows are advanced in lactation it will have to be warmed to 69 degrees. Never fill the churn over half full and churn in a warm room, and the butter will come quick and be firm and gather up good.

A Champion Young Holstein.
Katy Spontolone, owned by E. H. Knapp & Son, Fabius, N. Y., according to American Cultivator, holds the world's champion official record at age of 3 years, 1 month and 4 days, 20035 pounds milk, 20035 pounds butter in seven days, equivalent to 3550 pounds at full age.

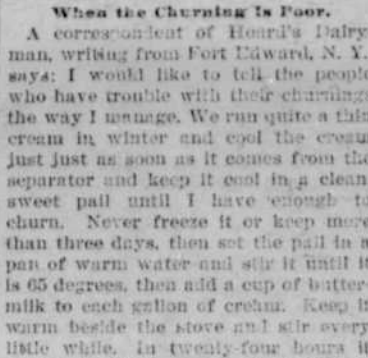
This record has never been equaled by a heifer in her class, 4301 pounds milk in sixty consecutive days, 4295 pounds in one day, 624 pounds 7 ounces in seven days. She had her first calf at 1 year, 9 months and 25 days, after which she gave 64 pounds 15 ounces of milk in a day, 13,076 pounds 11 ounces milk in one year, her economic test record with value of products \$60.61 and a net profit of \$1.67. No record yet reported equals these two amounts.

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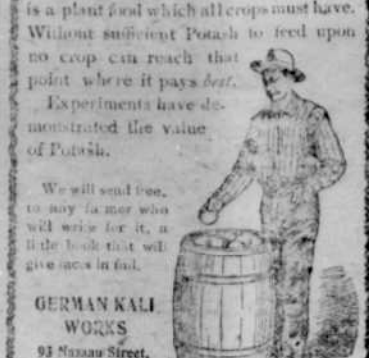
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
