Dr. Tufts defined the Anti-Saloon League to be the combined church forces of the state united upon a common non-partisan platform, to cooperate as an inter denominational movement sgainst the saloon traffic. He explained the local option issue to be self-government by majority rule upon the liquoi proposition. He declared the law would not be prohibition but a protective


