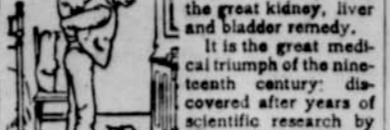

DALLAS and Salem Railroad.

Engineer Coover, of the Dallas and Falls City railroad, made a proposition to the people that if they would lend him \$72,000 for three years at 5 per cent, and give terminal grounds in West Salem and right of way to the Falls City place, he would build \$90,000 and build a railroad to Dallas. They sent D. J. Fry, E. T. Barnes and Clarence Hamilton to investigate the route and its incidents. They have reported favorably, the proposition has been accepted and a committee to secure terminal grounds and bond subscriptions to be secured by first mortgage on the road. If the requirements can be met it is proposed to begin work in July and complete it by Christmas. Mr. Coover has figured out that the road ought to make a net earning of \$100 per day.
