THE COMMON BOLL WEEVIL

Uses Thorns of the Night Apple to the Area Infested.

Plumbers, agricultural scientists and entomologists are all agreeing that the cotton boll weevil is the most serious pest of the cotton plant in the United States.

It is claimed by the division of entomology that methods which I judge to be essentially the same as those that it is proposed to exploit on a grand scale as practical object lessons have proved successful not only in the hands of the experts, but with many planters, during the past two very unfavorable seasons.

The detail of work which is credited with greatest advantage is the destruction of the plants in the fall, thus reducing the number of weevils, thus to be followed up by strenuous endeavor to produce an early crop the following season.

Mr. W. D. Hunter, the special agent in charge of past investigations, makes a number of practical recommendations following lines:

First—Co-operative demonstration on the organization of farmers in Texas and Louisiana for the cultivation of cotton on their farms under specific instruction from the department of agriculture.

Plant breeding and selection of existing varieties, making them earlier and more prolific, to be conducted on experimental farms.

Diversification of crops on farms in co-operation with their owners.

Investigation of parasites of the boll weevil in the effort to destroy it.
