From Turin comes now the latest device in street paving, which substitutes for asphalt a kind of parquetry of tile that are made of sand worked up with coal tar pitch. The tiles are laid on a basis of broken limestone and the joints filled in with asphalt. The result, which is cheaper than stone, asphalt or wood and about the same as concrete, is very durable. It is said to be very elastic and quiet. It has been tested to resist a pressure of 7,500 pounds to the square inch.—London Post.

THE COMBINATION HORSE.

How to Train and Care for a Colt

The natural gait of a horse is Natural Gait.

The combination horse is from fifteen to sixteen hands high, being naturally strong in general conformation and standing straight on his medium sized feet, with his legs well under his body. His round, fatlike toes point straight forward, as do his hoofs, and his tail is set in a single foot and running walk are the most desirable gait, although a few persons like the canter, slow pace or trot. The latter gait, however, is considered best for harness use unless a higher rate of speed is desired, says H. E. Buck in Farm and Ranch.

The pace is the foundation gait of the saddle horse. A colt that paces when it is foaled has brighter prospects than any other animal of his kind. When the colt is a week old he should be fed by the halter and the process repeated each week until he is weaned at the age of six months. The colt should then be bridled. When about eighteen months old he may be saddled. This gauges his disposition, and he may soon be ridden by a small boy from two to four miles every other day. Having come several gait under a saddle, it is time to harness and induce him to pull a cart. Deal gently with the colt. Do not encourage the use of whip or spur unless he is ill tempered. In such an event study the disposition of your charge, counter him by firmness and a whip if necessary. It is better.
