THE FIRST SCHOOL.

J. E. Lyle, who was one of the founders of Laclede academy, taught the first school in Polk county in 1845. It was held in the north hall of Col. Ford's double log cabin, near where Joshua Melton's big barn now stands. The room was about 12x16 feet, had a paneled floor and a wood and mud chimney. The students, Josephine Ford, who became the wife of Dr. Boye, Caroline Ford, afterwards Mrs. John Boyle, Sarah Ford, who married Judge S. T. Burch, Pauline Goff, who became Mrs. J. W. Nesmith, Caroline Goff, who married Crill Buckner, Amanda Thorp, who became the wife of Marcus A. Ford, and the mother of the present sheriff of this county, Ann Howard, Martha Howard, Mary Embree, now Mrs. T. J. Hayter, John Howard, Lydia Howard, Elvin Thorp, Theodore Thorp, Elmer Wood, Jas. Davis, Marion Goff, Marcus and T. V. B. Embree. Most of the students were the first term at the Jefferson school house, near the C. D. Embree homestead. He was the father of Mrs. Harriet Veszie of Portland and of Al and Will Lyle of the Princeton region. About all the books at first used were Webster's spellers and McGuffey's readers. Most of the slates were broken fragments, and the pencils were scraps of soapstones, picked out of the gravel beds. All of the Embrees and one of the Fords, who attended that first school, are still alive, but none of the Thorps or Goffs. Three of the Howards yet remain. John E. Lyle was a man of strong and decided convictions, believed in a high standard of morals and was always arrayed on the side that was most elevating. He was the friend of temperance and an enemy of slavery. He was a Christian, a scholar and a patriot to the core. He went to the Civil war and died there soon after the war.

Oregon At St. Louis

Though there has been some criticism of our exhibit at the world's fair, it has proved a very attractive feature. Nearly 10,000 visitors have registered at our state building since the fair opened. It is a reproduction of old Fort Clatsop constructed by Lewis and Clark 100 years ago. Our exhibit is an interesting agricultural, horticultural, educational, forestry, fish and game exhibit in different buildings devoted to such things. The Oregon building is made of fir and pine logs and contains five rooms. The educational displays are said to rank well with those of any other state. Eastern people look with amazement on our forestry exhibit, and our mineral displays surprise them in both variety and amount.

North Dallas

More than fifty years have flown since Dallas was first decided upon as the county seat and the first buildings were erected about where the cross roads now are but it proved so hard to get good water that in 1856 the town was moved to its present location. There has always been more of less population at the old town sight and perhaps a dozen years ago a German colony settled in and around the place and built a church there but gradually they drifted away and their church was taken down and carried to another county. For some years most of the buildings were empty but now they are all occupied and several additional ones have gone up. O. H. Cobb has a wagon shop and Jacob Hume a carriage shop there. The prune orchards of M. M. Ellis, Hugh Hayes, R. L. Chapman and L. C. Parker are adjacent. There is a good school building in the midst. The homes and their surroundings now present a better appearance than ever before. It has been known as Germantown because a many of that nationality lived there, but as most of them have moved away North Dallas is now the most appropriate name. A majority of the population are comparatively new comers and find employment at the neighboring sawmill and in the surrounding country. Nearly all the people there came from different parts of the east where there were extremes of heat and cold, great storms and other undesirable things.

There is now a telephone line from the home of W. H. Kraber near the reservoir into town. He is to have charge of the reservoir and see that it always has plenty of water.
