John McCulloch.

Was born in Scotland in 1840 and died near Ballston Dec. 9, '04. Coming to America in 1867 he spent a year on a Hudson river steamboat, and the first of June 1868 found him working on Broadmeads farm near Amity. In 1871 he rented the D. S. Baker farm near Ballston and continued to run it for over thirty years. In 1878 he bought the Thos. Hendricks place at Sherid in Junction and lived there until a year ago, when he moved to a nice new home at Ballston, intending to spend there the balance of what had been a very busy life. In 1871 he married Sabina, daughter of Andrew and Rachel Davidson, pioneers of 1846. He left a widow and four children, they being Mrs. Ella Billington, of Cottage Grove, Mrs. Devin Leisley of Portland, George and Mattie at home. His brother, Angus lives near Sheridan. Some twenty years ago he and wife visited his native home. He was a very successful farmer and left a carefully improved place. The farm contained 575 acres, seven miles of drainage tile and five miles of barbed wire fence. Within two years about \$2500 had been expended in improvements. He was kind to his family, loved his home, and his children were well educated and otherwise prepared to take care of themselves. He was a well-to-do man having neither money nor friends when he began life out west. John McCulloch's words were always as good as his bond and the sad faces of those who came to linger and gaze on his lifeless form, gave strong evidence of the esteem in which he was held.
