Thousands of bushels of fruit went to waste here last fall just for lack of an industry of this kind, and we surely hope that such conditions will not exist next fall. It would be a paying proposition as is clearly shown by the success of other canneries in other parts of the valley. In the lower story of the woolen mill we have a good building for the purpose already provided, and we understand from the president that the college people would be glad to rent it for such a purpose. No more suitable place could be found. Let us have a cannery, and start the movement at once.

PIONEER OF 1852 DEAD.

Mrs. Davies Gibson, Early Settler of Polk County.

Mrs. Sophronia Gibson, a pioneer of 1852, died yesterday at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Thomas Starbuck, Mr. Tabor, of old age. Mrs. Gibson's maiden name was Ingalls, and she was born near Bangor, Maine in 1815. When she was 2 years old the family moved to Ohio. Ten years later with her parents she went to Illinois. In 1829 she was married to Davies Gibson, and in 1852 they made the long journey to Oregon and settled on a farm in Polk county, near Salem. To the couple were born eight children, six of whom survive their mother:—George D., of Pomeroy, Wash., A. B., of Polk county, Mrs. F. L. Starbuck, of Portland, Ore., of Rickard, D. D., who lives on the old home place, and Mrs. Wm. Patrick, who lives in Tillamook county. She has been a member of the Christian church for over a half century. Her husband died in 1894, since which time she has resided with her children, all of whom were with her at the time of her death, except the oldest son, George. Besides her immediate family Mrs. Gibson had three brothers and one sister.

Another sister, Elizabeth, widow of J. V. B. Butler, died at Monmouth in 1901. The remains will be taken to Salem tomorrow morning and interment made in Spring Valley cemetery, beside the body of her husband.—Oregonian.
