Rev. J. M. McFee Dead.

Rev. J. M. McFee passed away at the home of his daughter, Mrs. George Cobble, at Black Rock, March 18, 1907, at the age of 74 years. His demise being hastened by a kidney trouble which has made him practically an invalid for a number of years. The remains were brought to Dallas Tuesday for interment and lay in the undertaking parlors until Wednesday morning, when it was taken in charge by Jennings Lodge, A. F. and A. M., and conducted to the Methodist church, and after services there, laid to rest in the Old Fellows cemetery, with the last sad rites of that fraternal order. Mr. McFee had been a member of the order since a young man, and ever a staunch believer in its principles. He was tall, and it was his last request that he be buried by them. The acting pall bearers were W. C. Vassell, H. G. Campbell, W. J. White, Holt McDaniel, H. J. Wiley and F. S. Ramsey. James Monroe McFee was born near the town of Gilmore, Ohio, Sept. 23, 1832, joined the Methodist church, February 14, 1848. At the age of 22 years he began teaching school and taught for twelve years. In 1856 he was married to Eliza Jane Dugan. He began preaching the gospel in 1866, preaching for five years, when he was ordained an elder in 1871, in Tiffin, Ohio, in the Muskingum annual conference. His beloved companion preceded him almost 21 years ago. He lived in and near Perry, Iowa, for a number of years, where his wife and eldest daughter died. The daughter at the age of 28, died one month and 17 days after the mother. His eldest son, Plato, died and was buried April last. He has one son, Landan McFee, of Nehalem, and one daughter, Mrs. G. M. Cobb, of Polk county, who survives him. He has been a resident of Polk county since 1880, living with his son, Plato, and his daughter. He had been a consistent christian since 15 years of age, and died with a strong faith in God.
