## Tells of Pleasure Trips Around Seattle.

Portland, Oregon, June 6, 1907. Dear Itemizer: My Polk County friends may enjoy a brief recital of my recent delightful observations and experiences on Puget Sound. In going the 200 miles between Dallas and Seattle I saw everywhere abundant evidences of progress and prosperity and noted a large travel in all directions. My aunt, Mrs. Lizzie Grant, met me at the train in Seattle and caused me to spend a most charming week at her home. Her husband, Capt. Thomas Grant, who has had charge of the steamers on the Sound for many years, is now in command of the beautiful excursion steamer Yosemite, which has a capacity of 1500 passengers and is constantly engaged in taking large pleasure parties to interesting points around the coast. I was granted a most enjoyable afternoon and evening trip. It has an electrical piano and the hand is paid \$1000 a fine dancing floor which accommodates from 40 to 50 couples and a special dancing master. A trained nurse is carried to care for babies or any other emergency. A first class restaurant furnishes all kinds of light refreshments but no strong drinks can be had. Sometimes half a dozen automobiles are taken along to scout through the country at the sound of the bugle. My uncle and aunt took me all over the Sound in their steamer, the scenery being unique and charming. One morning a trip was past the navy yard at Bremerton, where the brilliantly lighted war ships made a pretty picture. In the excursion to Port Townsend we had a carriage drive through the city and went by the Custom House and the Marine hospital located there. Our vessel also steamed close to Ironside, where large quantities of iron are being smelted. Biscuit fields, the beautiful state flower, grow in profusion around there. About 600 people went on our longest trip to the state capital, Olympia, and I had an electric car ride to Tumwater, where the famous Olympia beer is brewed. ## POLK FARMS THE STUFF.

### Harry Stutsman, an Old Polk Boy, Realizes Handsomely.

Nearly a year ago Harry Stutsman, engineer of the Buraside bridge, purchased a farm of 180 acres in Polk county on the Willamette river, 38 miles from Portland. This year he has harvested a big crop of fruit. His main charge reports that there will be 1000 bushels of peaches, between 400 and 500 bushels of apples, 1000 bushels of first class apples and 600 bushels of Bartlett pears. Last spring Mr. Stutsman had set out 499 English walnut trees, all of which are thriving. The farm is on the banks of the Willamette river, and the water is pure and clear. The first of the year water overflowed the orchard and the trees were damaged. Mr. Stutsman put in a cement fountain adaptable to the purposes suggested. Let us have such a convenient one before July 4th if possible.
