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Bays Hop Ranch.

Donald P. McCarthy, a hop buyer of this city, who has been in charge of the Ottumheimer hop office, has just purchased Mr. Ottumheimer's hop ranch of 123 acres, known as the "Pir Grove hop ranch," located on "Missouri Bottom," about one and a half miles from Independence, in Marion county. The business thus goes entirely into the hands of Mr. McCarthy, as Mr. Ottumheimer will devote himself in the future to his lumbering interests. The price paid was \$25,000. The annual output from the place has been 800 or 900 bales, although there are but 100 acres of the farm in hops. This is not regarded as a large profit by hop growers, considering the profits from the land, but the present dull hop market, together with the increased average is given as the cause of the reduction of increased hop land. - Salem Journal.
