It is rather bold in a man who has succeeded in making the Republican elephant do so many unheard of things, to denounce anybody for nature-faking.

Announcement comes from Oyster Bay that tariff revision is not to be undertaken until after the election. The announcement may result in some radical revision of ante-election estimates.

Tom Richardson, secretary of the Oregon Development League, in a recent letter printed in the "Oregonian" urges upon all good citizens to write a personal letter to their friends in the east, setting forth the attractions of Oregon as a place in which to live. He suggests that the ministers make a statement along this line to their congregations.

A number of the valley papers are advocating fruit and vegetable canneries for their towns, and some of them are already making starts in that direction. Now is the time for Dallas to get such a project started. It is never too early to begin a movement of such benefit to a community as a cannery would be. Dallas probably needs one more than any other town on the West Side.

Quite a hullabaloo has been raised by the Portland dailies lately regarding the sale of land to timber barons lately. The fact is that the land spoken of was sold to the parties named over 10 years ago, but the deeds are now being made a matter of record. In view of the controversy, recently raised on the subject, we believe that the Southern Pacific would hardly have the gall just now to really begin the sale of this land in direct contravention of the act of congress by which they acquired it. It would be a little too dangerous, as the government might see fit to take the whole business away from them.

While we do not wish to in any way discommode or inconvenience the workings of our water company, yet we do want to see the consumer get all that he possibly can for the money he is compelled to pay out. The irrigation problem came up for discussion at the council meeting Monday evening, but was laid over until Friday night, when it was said that Mr. Gates will be up, and a special meeting probably held to definitely decide on irrigation hours. The Itemizer holds that the hours now laid down by the company are not sufficient for the proper watering of the lawns, and that a longer time can be given without detriment to the service or in any way endangering the water supply of the town. If there is enough water to allow of the filling of mill ponds, there is surely water sufficient to irrigate for a longer time. It is probable that Mr. Gates will endeavor to hold the council to the hours now prescribed by him, and it remains to be seen whether he or the council have control of the matter. If the council cannot regulate this matter, it were better that we have no water works.
