SUSTAINS FRACTURE OF ARM. Polk County Farmer Falls From Top of Separator With Serious Results.

Henry McDowell, a farmer of Polk county, who resides a few miles from Salem, was severely injured by falling from the top of a separator which he was driving on the farm of R. Ennis Monday about 1:30 p. m. McDowell was driving a four-horse team, using four lines. The links which fastened the tongue to the axle suddenly broke and he was pulled off his seat by the lines. He fell head foremost on the ground, alighting on one hand and the side of his face. When he got up he found that his forearm was broken and that he had been severely bruised about the head. He immediately went to his home and Dr. W. H. Byrd of Salem was summoned. On examining the patient he found that the injuries to the head were nothing more than bad bruises, and that there were no internal injuries.
