COUNCIL MEETINGS.
Bids Filed for Rock Crusher and Road Roller.

The council met in regular session last Monday evening, with all officers present except Alderman Staffin and Van Orsdel and City Engineer Morrison.

On motion of Councilman Grant, the Astoria sidewalk was ordered moved to the street line.

Alderman Shaw reported that the petition of D. C. Crider to erect a corrugated iron building within the fire limits had not been allowed.

Mrsor Muir and Alderman Coad reported at length on their visit as a committee to investigate the working of rock crushers at Portland, Fairmount and Hoquiam, but made no recommendation in regard to any particular type of rock crushers.

The city attorney reported that the deed for the rock quarry recently purchased by the city had been made a matter of record.

Hearing was closed in regard the new cement sidewalk in front of the ice works and an ordinance was read for the first time providing for the same.

An ordinance was passed for a number of new sidewalks, as was also the street grade ordinance.

An ordinance providing for better plumbing was laid over.

Several representatives of rock crushers and rollers appeared before the board and submitted bids, which will be considered by the council at an adjourned meeting to be held next Monday night.

H. V. Gates appeared regarding irrigation rates. As the season is about at an end and no hours were agreed upon.

An amendment to the electric light ordinance was read the first time, providing that all poles be set in the ground to the depth of 4 feet; that when poles are set in cement walks, all poles be left around them; and that all poles be water tamped when set.

THRILLING RESCUE.
Dick Madison and North Cherrington too Venturesome.

Richard Madison, North Cherrington and Ted Crawford, three well-known business men of Dallas, narrowly escaped death in the entrance to Yaquina bay Monday afternoon.

The three men secured a row boat Monday noon and rowed down the bay until they approached the bar. A strong tide was running out, at that time and before the men realized it the boat was caught and was drifting out to sea.

It was noon, however, when the lookout at the Yaquina Bay Life-saving station and when it was apparent that the men were losing ground and were in great danger he sounded the alarm calling out the crew. By this time the boat was drifting toward the rocks at the end of the abandoned jetty works. Charles Anderson, known in Newport as "Sea Lion" Charlie, and Lee Doty were in a boat on the bay, and seeing the danger of the men ran into the breakers and succeeded in getting a line to them.

Soon afterward the life saving crew arrived and pulled both boats into safety. By the time the time the rescue was completed a large crowd had collected on the north beach to watch it. Anderson and Doty were highly praised for their venture into the breakers and to them belongs the chief honor of the rescue, though the services of the government life-savers were needed to complete it.
