OVER AT OTTER ROCK.

The Coming Resort of the Oregon Coast—Magnificent, Slightly and Easy to Get at.

Recently we had the pleasure of visiting this rapidly becoming known picturesque resort. It is located nine miles from Nye Creek, and some four miles from the Newport light house. Hon. B. F. Jones and H. R. Nebras, local superintendents, have secured there some 80 acres of land and had it platted as a town site. Now for a few words as to the many superior advantages of this location and the reasons why it is superior to any of the other locations on the Oregon coast: First, it has all of the advantages of all of the other locations, and none of their drawbacks. If you desire to go there for sport, you can have it in all its branches. The trout fishing, up a creek located about ten miles away, is the best in the state, and it is a common occurrence for a good angler to bring in a string that would surprise you for only a limited time of sport. The deep sea fishing is unsurpassed, and the beauty of it is that you can row out in a small boat without any danger attaching, and in a few hours bring back your boat laden with the famous cod fish and other varieties peculiar to ocean fishing. The resort will develop into quite an industry in the near future, as soon as transportation facilities improve and means are provided for the keeping of the fish while enroute to a market. The cod, especially, will not lack for a market as soon as this is done, as there is no greater delicacy extant, and the supply on the Atlantic coast is rapidly becoming much abbreviated. It is the intention of the promoters to eventually build a pier over the line of breakers, and such can easily be done, so as to admit of small schooners doing the fishing and unloading their catch at the wharf, without having to enter some bay at another place. It is expected that this will be the terminus of the Dallas and Falls City railroad, being right in line with their present survey and most adaptable for its coast terminus. The road will pass right through a green belt of fir and spruce timber nearly all the way from Falls City and timber cruisers estimate that there is thirteen million feet of timber in this territory. On account of this place being sheltered and protected from the north west winds which prevail from the middle of May until the first of October there is hardly ever a day that a small boat cannot go out upon the old Pacific in perfect safety, a and postoffice or trainway

could be built out for a half mile beyond the outer reef so that any vessel that sails the Pacific could take on or discharge cargo six months out of the year.

Owners of fishing smacks can then have the best of transportation facilities, and be able in short order to put their catch in the doors of the consumers—the residents of the entire western state of Oregon. Deep-sea fishing on the Oregon coast has never yet attained to the height of a great industry, but the time is coming, and that in the not far distant future, when it will be one of the great means of raking in the almighty dollar, the same as it now is on the Atlantic seaboard. The fish are there, and all that needs to be done is to catch them and get them to market in as little time as possible. Fishing from the rocks in this vicinity is a sport that many find supreme enjoyment in, and you can get the best of rock oysters there, clams are abundant, and all other kinds of shell fish have only to be gone after. There are lots of wild blackberries within easy reach, and blueberries and huckleberries too numerous to mention. Bear and deer are hunted in season with great success, they being more plentiful there than anywhere else on the coast. Quite a number of bears have been killed near there in the last few weeks; at this season they coming down near the coast for the huckleberries and other edible fruits.

The location of the townsite is the most picturesque one that it has ever been a pleasure to behold. It is located on a bench of some 50 feet in height, right on the ocean beach, and giving a view of the ocean from every portion of it that is simply magnificent, awe inspiring, and an unparalleled treat to the eye or she who thus beholds it for the first time. When you stand upon that elevated grassy plot and look out over the vast expanse of tumultuous, ever-changing mass of shimmering, blue and green, never still, but seeming in all its immensity to be in full of desire to shut out your view of the empyrean at the horizon, with its frontpiece of roaring tumbling breakers beyond which you often see the mighty creatures of the deep despoiling themselves like children at play; to the left the rugged point on which the lighthouse is situated, and the light itself bearing its white head as a warning to the incautious mariner; to the right the wooded point on which you stand sheltered from the breezy wind which plays havoc with the complexion, soon turning it from an anemic white to a healthy, rosy brown, your soul cannot but be filled with a great thankfulness that you are allowed to witness such a pleasing spectacle and a great respect for the Creator who planned these things for the enjoyment of mankind. The background of the townsite is covered with a dense growth of noble firs, the cold north-west wind, and making the resort one of the most desirable places that we have ever visited. As we were on the bank a mammoth whale, deceived by the gentle slope of the beach, and in the act of coming ashore, some kind of which great schools frequently cast themselves far upon the beach, ran his nose into the beach, and turning a summersault, labored and thrashed around for some time before he got back into deep water once more. His distress brought others of his tribe, and for some time the surf seemed alive with the spouting, blowing leviathans. We never witnessed a grander sight. The bathing facilities are simply beyond compare. The beach is an extremely wide one with an easy slope, and you do not strike deep water for a great distance out in the ocean. If you so desire you can go into the breakers where the water is nearly as smooth as a mill pond, with absolutely no danger to the most unlearned, and entirely sheltered from the sea breeze, or you can go farther down the beach and get all you desire in both breakers and wind. Both houses have built on the beach, and by the way, this spring water is the best and purest to be found anywhere on the globe. It has been piped through the streets and is abundant in quantity and quality for drinking and irrigation purposes. Rock agates are found on the beach in sufficient quantities to satisfy the persistent searcher. Ocean steamer are frequently seen from the beach, and prove a most gratifying sight. One

great attraction of this resort, located about a half mile from the town site, and on the point of land on which the site is situated, is what is known as the Punch bowl. It is a circular opening in the rock of about 100 feet in diameter, connecting with a large cavern that runs in from the sea by an opening of much smaller dimensions. It is supposed to be the crater of an extinct volcano, and words of awe are inadequate to describe it. It must be seen to be appreciated in all its immensity and grandeur. Out in the ocean from the point mentioned are two rocks, rearing their jagged heads far above the ceaselessly breaking waves, and forming in themselves a picture of no mean aspect. They are called Otter and Seal rocks, and after the former is the resort named. They derive their names from the otter and seal that constantly make them a roosting place and also of propagation. Great sport is had in trying to kill them, and it can also be made quite lucrative, as the skin of a good otter is valued at about \$500. It is an easy matter to row out to these rocks. Of the scenic beauties and many advantages of this resort we could write for hours, but time and space prohibit us. The climate in winter there is even more salubrious than in summer, and the day will soon come when we will see our health here, by going there to spend the winter months and availing themselves of the life giving ozone that is handed out in such great quantities and free for the asking. The proprietors will soon utilize their great water power to assist them in extracting gold and platinum from a great deposit of sand they have there, by a process now being tried at Hood river, and which promises great returns. They also hope to use this power some day to run an electric line to Newport and furnish that town with lights.
