HOW TO ACQUIRE LAND.

land states. Detailed information is difficult to give, on account of the rulings of the general land office which is necessary to fit all cases. The homestead law is extremely difficult of explanation because of the requirements and qualifications. Generally speaking every person of the required age, either man or woman, who has not used his or her homestead right or who has not acquired title to more than 320 acres of land, including the tract applied for under this law, may secure 180, 80 or 40 acres of land by living upon and cultivating the land for five years. The meaning of actual residence upon and meaning of actual residence upon and caltivation of the land we will not endeavor to explain, but it will suffect to say that proof of good faith of the claimant must be established. The commutation clause in the homestead law provides that after forces as the said of the commutation clause in the homestead law provides that after forces as the said of vides that after fourteen months residence the claimant may make proof and acquire the title by the payment of \$1.25 per acre, and a few dollars additional cost in making final five year proof. The cost does not necessarily exceed \$35.

Any citizen of the required age, 21 years for men and 18 years for women. may purchase for \$2.59 per acre, 160, 80 or 40 acres of land under the "timber and stone" act of June 8, 1878. The course to pursue under this act is to go upon the land, satisfy yourself and two witnesses as to the character of the land, make filings at the United States land office within the land district where the land is situated. Notice of intention to purchase must be publish when final proof can be made by the payment of \$2.50 peracre, together with

The desert land act gives a person not be exceed 320 acres of desert land, upon to exceed 320 acres of desert land, upon the payment of \$1.25 per acre; 25 cents per acre down and the balance in five years when final proof is made. The performance of certain duties is required, such as doing work upon the land to the amount of one dollar per acre.

One can purchase school and coll One can purchase school and college land in this state for \$2.50 per acre. Swamp and overflow lands can also be acquired from the state.

For detailed information about any of the government lands or how to acquire them the U. S. Land office furnishes circulars free upon application.
