**Putting in New Boiler.**  
 The Willamette Valley company are installing a new set of 312 horse power boilers at their big plant in the southern part of the city. This will make four boilers of that capacity now in use. They will be used alternately, one set of two boilers being used at a time. This plant is one of the largest to be found

anywhere, and serves a whole lot of people in the three towns of Dallas, Monmouth and Independence and is so fixed as to run Albany's plant, if it should happen to go out of commission. It is a wonder that more families living close to the line do not avail themselves of electricity, both for lighting purposes and for motive power. **NEW INCORPORATION.**  
**Willamette Valley Company Incorporates to Build Electric Line.**  
 Manager Kearns, of Dallas, verifies the account given above of what is intended to revitalize the travel facilities of the Willamette Valley, which we clip from Monday night's Journal.  
 "A larger plan of electric railway development in the Willamette valley and central Oregon than has ever before been undertaken is being launched by A. W. Cooper, of Dallas, and the Willamette Valley company, owners of electric light plants at various points, and builders of the Eugene street railway and other projects.  
 "With a nominal capital of \$1,000,000 they today incorporated the Portland, Eugene & Eastern Railway company, for the purpose of building an electric road from Portland to Salem, Eugene, Yaguna, Prineville and Ontario, with branches to various towns.  
 "The total mileage contemplated in their undertaking is in excess of 800 miles. They propose to develop from the Mackenzie, the Santiam and the Deschutes rivers and streams in central Oregon the enormous power necessary for operating the system planned.  
 "Papers were filed yesterday in the Multnomah county clerk's office by Attorneys John McNary and C. L. McNary, of Salem, acting for the company, completing its incorporation and setting forth an outline of its purposes. The incorporators are J. G. Story, J. C. Bracher, George Bracher, A. W. Cooper, M. H. Hall, John H. McNary. "According to the incorporation papers the following lines of electric road will be built: From Portland to Salem, thence to Eugene, from which point they will branch out in several directions. A line from Eugene via Springfield and the Mackenzie river valley will extend to Prineville and thence across the state to Ontario. "Another line from Eugene will tap Yaguna Bay and lines will also connect Eugene with Florence, Cottage Grove, Corvallis, Wendling, Mehama and Dallas, passing through Lane, Polk and Lincoln counties. "This is the most ambitious scheme of electric railroad development yet undertaken in Oregon. How long it will take to develop is of course problematical. The backers say they have completed the nucleus, which is the Eugene Electric railway, and that they have rights of way and water powers already secured for a large part of the line.  
 "They have been at work more than a year on the preliminaries of the project. It is said their proposed line from Portland to Salem and Eugene will pass on the east side of the Willamette river.  
 "The work of construction will be commenced in Salem and this will be done right away, or within a few weeks. It will be pushed. The project is fully financed.  
 Messrs. Story and Bracher, who are among the incorporators, are Chicago capitalists, and represent still larger capital. They have lately invested five hundred thousand to a million dollars in Oregon timber, mostly in the southern portion of the state.  
 This is the company that has completed the Eugene street railway line. It is building the interurban line from Eugene to Springfield. The company has already invested a good deal over \$100,000 in actual construction, surveys, rights of way and other preliminaries.

**HANGS HIMSELF.**  
**Last Thursday's Murderer Commits Suicide in Dallas Jail.**  
 Enoch Spores, the Indian from Grand Ronde reservation who brutally murdered his squaw while both were drunk, hanged himself in his cell in the county jail here Friday night. He left a strange document, partly a confession of his crime and partly a will. Spores used two handkerchiefs and a shoestring to make a noose. Beside his body on the floor lay the remarkable document left by the suicide, purporting to be a narrative of the circumstances leading to the murder of his squaw, and also his last will and testament. It covered one side of a sheet of wrapping paper two feet square. He professed nothing low for his murdered spouse and claimed to know nothing about striking the death blow. He asked to be buried beside his wife at Grand Ronde.  
 A letter, addressed to Jake Fearn, Astoria, Ore., runs as follows:  
 Dallas, Oregon, Nov. 22, 1907.  
 I am going to hang myself here in this jail because I am going to worry as my best friend she has left me her death come first and my death shall end last God be with you tell me meet again we have made our promise another letter to you never will. I have loved her in my true heart but I have no father, no mother, no sister nor brother so I am better off than see no more of her will not think of her no more.  
 Remembrance of my last describing this will be in to think how I meeting my temptation. Good by.  
 To Jake Fearn, Astoria. One please send it to him.  
 Enoch Andrew Spores Born Cottage Grove Ore Sept 26 1880  
 5 o'clock p m  
 A number of letters contained a rambling and disconnected story of his wife's death, in which he says he does not remember fighting although she abused him all night. He said he had a hand lot of consisting of 480 acres. This he desired to have divided between Polk Scott of Grand Ronde and Jake Fearn, of Astoria.  
 Spores was a man of fine physical development. He was usually of a quiet and peaceable disposition, when intoxicated. He had been a Chemawa student. He was writing the two letters when Deputy Sheriff Richter carried him to the jail. He said he had paid no attention to the fact and had no suspicion of the prisoner's intention.  
 Justice Charles Hagan, acting as coroner, empaneled the following jury, consisting of J. A. McCann, J. M. Sears, F. J. Morrison, H. B. Cooper, F. F. Meyer and W. M. Haines, who after inquiring into the facts, announced as their verdict that Spores came to his death by hanging—a plain case of suicide.  
 Saturday night a number of Indians arrived from Grand Ronde and took the body back for burial Sunday morning.  
 The whole matter is a case which the way in which civilization benefits the Indian. Both former students of the Chemawa school, they were all decent people, after their return to the reservation instead of using their acquired knowledge to advantage they descended the scale of human intelligence and made beasts of themselves.
