The meeting was called for 2 o'clock in the afternoon, but so enthusiastic were the hop men in the matter and so anxious to hear ways of bettering their condition discussed, that they convened in the morning and listened to explanations of the objects of the association by A. L. Shinn, of Sacramento, and Senator E. F. Woodward, of Santa Rosa, prominent California hop growers and projectors of the Pacific Hop Growers' union. These gentlemen explained the plans of the union in detail, and their discourses were listened to with great appreciation and profound interest. They showed the need for such an organization and how by the right kind of management and sticking together and toward an ultimate object success could be assured.

#### SHEPARD AT MONMOUTH.

Secretary of Development League Gathering Facts.

J. R. Shepard met with great encouragement at the Monmouth Farmers and Fruit Growers' Institute Saturday, where he made an address, opening the campaign for One Thousand Facts of Production for the Willamette Valley. He has secured over 100 statements of fact from Marion and Polk counties the past week, each one of them a ringer, and verified over the signature of the man who produced the crop. Mr. Shepard impressed the audience with the great need of more immigration. More people he argues means higher values for lands, better roads, better support for schools and churches, and every man who is a producer and every man who has the development of this country at heart should help in this campaign for the facts of production. First get your facts and then circulate them, says Shepard. The facts, and the facts alone, will do the business of bringing us our share of the tides of immigration sweeping westward.

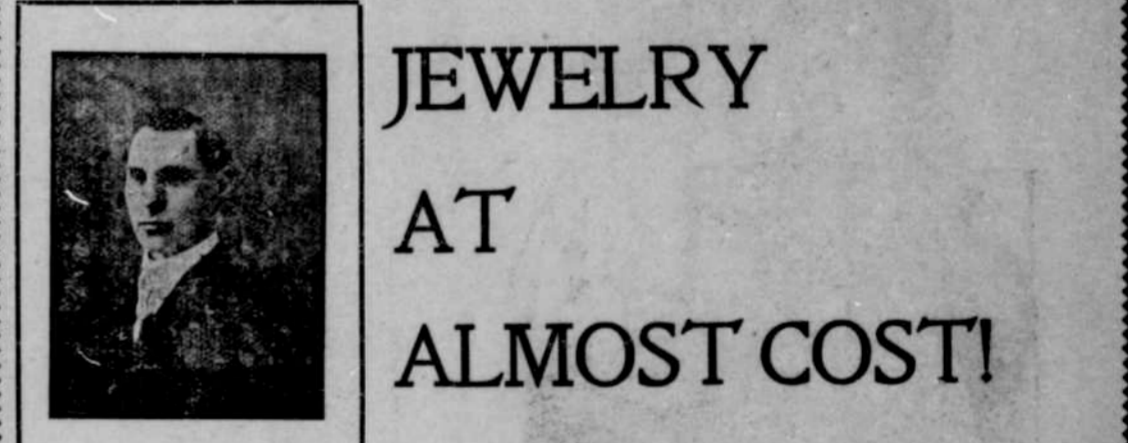
